### **ACTIVITIES ORGANIZED IN 2012-2013**

#### *Celebration of Important Days*

##### *Independence Day (15.08.2012)*

Independence Day was celebrated with great zeal and enthusiasm at Society for Prevention of Cruelty to Animals SPCA, Sector 38-A, Chandigarh. Dr. S.K. Sharma, Founder Director, SPCA hoisted the National Flag. President Dr. J. C. Kochar and Executive Members of SPCA were also present on the occasion. Patriotic songs,

poems and inspirational speeches were presented by the students. The Principal, Dr. Jyoti Khanna in her address signified the importance of this day for the animal world because the law relating to cruelty to animals was amended and extended to the experimental animals used for scientific research on 15<sup>th</sup> of August 1876. She thanked the students for their contribution in making the programme a success and appreciated the initiative taken by Programme Officers Dr. Richa Chibber and Mrs. Kiranjit Kaur. Monetary contribution for the welfare of the animals was also made by the NSS volunteers. The programme was concluded with distribution of sweets.

### ***Sadbhavna Diwas (18.08.2012)***

Sadbhavna Divas was observed in the college premises to commemorate the birth of late prime minister of India, Shri Rajiv Gandhi, with an aim to promote good will, national integrity and communal harmony irrespective of caste, creed and religion. The students took the Sadbhavna oath and pledged to work towards emotional oneness and for maintaining harmony of India regardless of the societal barriers. The principal Dr. Jyoti Khanna highlighted the importance of the day and said that it has become necessary for every citizen especially for teachers committed to the philosophy of oneness to protect the entire territorial integrity of India, as the future of the nation is in the hands of teachers. Various competitions including 'Paragraph Writing' and 'Slogan Writing' on the theme "National Integration" were also organized to mark the occasion. ### ***Celebration of Teacher's day (5.9.2012)***

Teacher's day was celebrated by holding an Eye Donation Awareness Camp in the college premises. A team of doctors from GMCH - 32, PGI and Grewal Institute sensitized the prospective teachers regarding eye donation and also removed the myths and fallacies associated with eye donation. A skit was presented by the students on the theme "Netra Daan Maha Daan". To mark the occasion other activities included were Poetry writing, Slogan writing and Poster making and prizes were given to the winners. The Principal, Dr. Jyoti Khanna, administered the

oath relating to the Code of Professional Ethics of teachers to guide them in discharging their obligations towards students, parents, colleagues and community as increased awareness of the ethical principles governing the teaching profession is essential to ensure 'professionalism' among teachers.

### ***Literacy Day (8-09-2012)***

To highlight the importance of literacy to individuals, communities and societies and to raise people's awareness and concern for literacy issues in the world Literacy Day was celebrated with great enthusiasm in the college campus. Students presented various programs like dance, poem recitation and skit. Dr. Monika Mittal, Dermatologist was the chief guest for the occasion. She emphasized the significance of literacy for healthy societies, with a strong emphasis on epidemics and communicable diseases such as HIV, tuberculosis and malaria and discussed various skin problems like acne, signs of ageing and the use of medicated products to handle the hair fall problems. She highlighted the factors affecting skin and hair and suggested various measures to cure these. Later on she satisfied the queries of the students as well as the teachers. Dr. Jyoti Khanna (principal) thanked the guest and appreciated the efforts of the students.

### ***Hindi Divas (14.9.2013)***

"Hindi is our mother tongue. It is a scientific language. In our thirst for exploring new horizons of knowledge and learning new languages, we should not forget our mother tongue," was the message given by Dr. Jyoti Khanna (principal) in the inaugural address on Hindi Diwas. She also informed the students that on September 14, 1949, the Constituent Assembly of India unanimously resolved that Hindi would be the national language of India. Sh. Uday Kumar Sinha, Editor, Amar Ujala was the Chief Guest on the occasion. In his address, Sh. Uday Kumar Sinha emphasized the responsibility of society in contributing for making Hindi a living language and highlighted the role and duty of teachers to make the media as well as students aware of writing accurate Hindi.

Essay Writing, Slogan Writing, Doha and Poem Recitation competitions on the theme “Rashtra Bhasha Hindi” were held to mark the day. A skit was also presented on the theme “Na Bhul Apni Pehchan”. Dr. Jyoti Khanna, Principal recited a Hindi poem highlighting the importance of a National Language and appreciated and congratulated the students for organising the event and making it a success. She motivated the students to take pride in using our mother tongue in everyday life. The function concluded with the distribution of prizes to the winners of various categories.

#### ***World Ozone Day (15-09-12)***

Student From over ten Colleges of the city participated in the contests. Sh. Santosh Kumar, Director, Department of Science and Technology was the Chief Guest on the occasion.

Addressing the participants Sh. Santosh Kumar said that the young people should raise awareness for a collective action by the community as a whole to promote the message of living in harmony with man and nature. And ‘World Ozone Day’ reminds us for our duty towards conservation of environment. He further said Ozone layer in the stratosphere absorbs a large part of the Sun’s biologically harmful ultraviolet radiation and so its preservation becomes all the more important.

The judges were famous cartoonist Sandeep Joshi, artist Suresh Pushkar and media consultant Dr. Ramesh Kapitta awards were distributed on the basis of their judgement in different categories. Dr. Jyoti Khanna, the presented a vote of the thanks to all participants and prominent guest.

#### ***Children’s Day (14<sup>TH</sup> November, 2012)***

Children’s Day was celebrated in the school during practice teaching. The day started on with an energetic Gidda performance. Followed by Gidda, the students were mesmerized by a juggling session accompanied with Dhol Beats. A class 10 student displayed amazing skill of rare balancing act. The skits depicting the plight

of girls especially in poor whom are considered as burden and deprived of education, child marriage were also performed by class 6 students. The other items included to celebrate the day were Bhangra and songs. In the end, Ms Parminder Kaur Grewal, the honorable Principal of the school extended her warm wishes and blessings to the students.

***National Integration Week (19<sup>th</sup> Nov to 25<sup>th</sup> November)***

National integration week was observed from November 19-25 to reinforce the spirit of communal harmony, national integration and pride in India's vibrant culture and nationhood. Various activities were conducted in the schools by student teachers during their practice teaching that include observance of 'Welfare of Minorities Day' to observe the birth anniversary of the first education minister of India Moulana Abul Kalam Azad. The school children took out the march around the school campus, emphasizing "equality and harmony", the message that all religions should enjoy an equal status and representation was magnificently communicated by the students. A special literary function, in the form of "Kavi Sammelan" was organised on the 'Linguistic Harmony Day', where poems in Hindi, English and Punjabi were read out by the students. ## **SENSITIZATION AND AWARENESS ACTIVITIES**

### ***World Human Rights Day (10.12.2012)***

Students were oriented regarding eligibility conditions, schematic pattern of the test , procedure, syllabus and validity conditions of Central Teacher Eligibility test (CTET) conducted by CBSE. A talk was followed by an interactive session during which the queries of prospective teachers were answered meticulously by the resource person Ms. Ruchi Uppal (a Career Consultant).

#### **5. Examination Reforms Implemented**

The college conducts internal house tests twice a year as per the university rules The college also conducts class tests from time to time to make the students face the annual examinations with confidence. The question papers set for the house tests are on the pattern of the University examination. Internal assessment is also given on the basis of marks in these tests as per university rules.

The following examination reforms were implemented:

- Continuous Comprehensive Evaluation was done throughout the year assessing the students' performance in scholastic and co-scholastic areas.
- The internal assessment system and student attendance was made fully transparent and it was displayed on the notice boards.
- The mistakes committed during the exams were brought to the notice of the students, which enabled them to identify and rectify those mistakes in the university examinations.
- The whole examination process is done under the guidance of the examination committee.
- Question banks containing long and short answer questions were provided to students so as to give them better preparations for exams.

#### ***1. Stress Free Living and Positive Thinking (21<sup>st</sup> August, 2012)***

An talk by sister Sapna and Mrs. Ranjeet from Brahmakumari Institute, Rajyog Bhavan, Sector 33, Chandigarh, was organised in the college. During the session Sister Sapna elaborated on the meaning of stress, illusions about stress and vicious cycle of stressful thinking that goes like thinking - feelings - behavior - performance. She also highlighted on different moods of a person namely, aggressive, anxious, arrogant, bored, confident, undecided and indifferent. How these moods predict the behavior and performance of a person. She concluded by the message that "You only have control over things when you are detached from them." To control your behaviour and mood swings one must have a sense of detachment from this materialistic words.

#### ***2. Workshop on Spiritual Meditation (21<sup>st</sup> August, 2012)***

The workshop was conducted on "Spiritual Meditation" by Mr. Kanhaya Lal Sharma, Mediator and Treasurer from Chandigarh Pyramid Spiritual Society. He emphasized on spiritual meditation as the only possible way of connecting to the ultimate reality. He said that while doing meditation one can catch a glimpse of different visions, and these visions represent the aura and sensation of divine power and light in and around us. In the end, techniques of meditation were demonstrated



by the resource person who was followed by the workshop of 40 minutes to practice meditation by the student teachers. The main objective of the workshop was to lead a stress free life, to isolate oneself from tensions in order to have a free mind to increase concentration and grasping power. He also highlighted the benefits of Pyramid meditation which is helpful in immediate healing of all diseases, reduces physical and mental stress, increases self confidence, enhances peace and happiness; on the whole Pyramid meditation can help in understanding the purpose of life.

Dr. (Mrs.) Jyoti Khanna Principal introduced the theme by saying that the teacher must play a constructive and significant role in taking India to newer heights. She welcomed the Chief Guest Dr. Nandita Singh, Chairperson Department of Education, Panjab University; Guest of Honour Dr. D. R. #### **14. Community Service**

Community service forms an integral part of the community outreach initiative of the college. Social service is a very important aspect of the curriculum and altruistic feeling for the community is instilled in the prospective teachers by way of active participation in projects involving visiting and rendering social service at various social organizations. Various activities concerning the community service in 2012-13 were:

**'Sirjana'** - A 10 Days workshop for special children was organised from 11<sup>th</sup> May to 20<sup>th</sup> May 2012 with an objective to bring forth the hidden talents of these special children so that despite their disabilities, they are able to overcome their handicap. Another objective behind holding such a camp for special children is to sensitize the future teachers so that these children should not be ignored. This is just a small effort in this direction so that they do not feel left out. Special children from various institutes and other keen enthusiasts from all over the city participated in the workshop. Sh. Bikram Singh Rana, State Liaison Officer, NSS cell, Chandigarh was the chief guest on the occasion. Dr. (Mrs.) Jyoti Khanna Principal of the college in her welcome address enlightened the audience about the efforts of the college in providing directions to special children. She said that the workshop is an old feature of the college that started in 1998. She further added that during these 10 days, children would be taught various skills like art and craft, stitching, candle making, tie and dye etc. Sh. Bikram Singh Rana was all praise for the workshop and said that the college was doing a commendable job by conducting such workshops for special children as they get training in developing the skills that can earn them a lively hood along with an opportunity to interact with each other and learn many things despite their disabilities.

Around 40 special children from various institutes that include Mother Teresa Missionaries of Charity, Sec-23, Chandigarh, Savera - Short Stay Home and Institute for the blinds Sector 26 and Bapu Dham colony participated in the workshop. The special children were taught music, dance, art and craft, bag stitching, pot painting, etc. during the workshop. Mr. Jasbir Gill, Theatre artist taught choreography to the

children. On the concluding day the children presented a cultural programme. The articles prepared by the children during the workshop were also displayed in the exhibition. The special children also presented a skit on the theme of patriotism. However, the Mr. Parmod Kumar, president, Yuvsatta, presented on the occasion talked about various social evils prevailing in the society. A film on the theme of service to mankind was also shown on the occasion. Mr. Jayra, Headmaster, Institute for the blind said that such workshops are very beneficial for these children to boost their confidence. He congratulated the principal for her commendable efforts. The chief guest on the valedictory day, Mrs. Rajani Mahajan, State Pedagogical coordinator SSA, Chandigarh, appreciated the earnest efforts of the college to initiate such programme for the special children. The children were also distributed small gifts as token of love.

#### ***Eye donation Awareness camp (5.9.2012)***

Free eye Check up and Eye donation awareness camp was organised to mark the occasion of Teacher's Day. The camp was a collaborative venture by a team of doctors from GMCH, Sector 32; PGI and Grewal Eye Institute, Sector 9, CHD and Dr. S K Arya, Prof. Deptt. Of Ophthalmology, GMCH, Sector 32 who clarified the myths and misconceptions about eye donation and eye pledging. Dr. Chintan Malhotra, Asst. Prof. PGI highlighted the causes of eye damage and how eyesight can be restored through corneal transplantation through power point presentation. Sh. Amarjit Singh, Sh. Amritpal Singh and Mr. Raghavendra, social workers were also present on the occasion. A skit was presented by the college students on the theme "Netra Daan Maha Daan" to disseminate the information regarding eye donation. Poetry writing, Slogan writing and Poster making competitions were also organised for their students to spread awareness about the cause. The students also spoke about consumer awareness where they emphasized the need to check up things like an ISI mark on electronic goods and asking for a computer generated bill or receipt for goods purchased.

Paper Reading session was followed by a soul stirring Patriotic Song - "Ab jaago sab jaago" the theme of the song revolved around individual responsibility to stop

corruption and awake to consciousness from deep slumber of accepting things the way they are. It was presented by the students of class 9 and 10.

Poster Making and Slogan Writing Competition were also organized to give way to the numerous creative ideas to express the theme of consumer awareness and anti-corruption.

#### ***Communal Harmony Day (30<sup>th</sup> October, 2012)***

In order to instil a feeling of unity and fraternity among the students, a Communal Harmony Day was celebrated in various Government Schools of Chandigarh. The event mainly included a 'Paper Reading' contest in the morning assembly of the school. #### ***Anti-Cracker Diwali Campaign (3<sup>rd</sup> Nov 2012)***

'Anti-Cracker Diwali Campaign' was organized in various Practice Teaching schools. Various events were organized under the inspiration and guidance of Dr. Richa Chibber & Mrs. Kiranjit Sidhu at various Government Schools of Chandigarh. Colorful posters depicting and endorsing a big "No" to crackers were prepared by the students and later on displayed in the school premises. It was creativity at its best when beautiful slogans were written by students on this occasion conveying a strong message against crackers.

#### ***World Blood Donation Day (1-12-12)***

To create awareness among people regarding blood donation, an awareness rally was taken out by the NSS volunteers in the Dadu Majra village. Volunteers along with the residents of the village holding placards in their hands participated in the rally. The students raised the slogan 'Donate Blood, Save Lives' during rally. Door to door awareness campaign was also conducted during which NSS volunteers,

pointing out to the significance of blood donation, said the blood donated was invariably a life saver during an accident, or for serious ailments such as blood cancer, where donated blood serves for blood transfusion. Persons between 18 and 60 years of age were permitted to donate blood. Breast feeding mothers, pregnant women, and those, who had gone under knife should refrain from blood donation. Throwing light on the mechanism of blood recharge, and clearing misconceptions concerning safety of blood donors, the volunteers stated that the human body hosts over 5 litres of blood and just about 350 millilitres of blood is taken during donation. The students raised the slogan 'Donate Blood, Save Lives' during rally.

### ***Blood Donation Camp (29.12.2012)***

As a part of the ongoing Founders Day Celebrations of Dev Samaj, a Blood Donation Camp was organized in collaboration with Govt. Medical College and Hospital, Sector 32, Chandigarh. It was inaugurated by Dr.Raj Bahadur, Director-Principal, GMCH, Sector 32, Chandigarh. This camp has been the regular feature of Dev Samaj College Of Education.

While addressing the gathering, Dr.Raj Bahadur appreciated and congratulated the students of the college for participating in such a noble cause. He also took the opportunity to sensitize the student teacher on social issues like female foeticide, child labour etc. People participated in the cause with immense zeal and enthusiasm. The college students volunteered for coordinating the event by supervising and offering help by guiding people , promoting and helping in organizing the Blood Donation camp. The camp was a great success and in all around hundred blood units were collected. The blood donors included the students of Dev Samaj College, their relatives and the people from the various communities. ### ***Pulse Polio Campaign (20<sup>nd</sup> - 22<sup>nd</sup> Jan 2013)***

NSS units of the college observed the National Immunization Days for Pulse Polio as a commitment to make India polio free. On 16 January training was provided by team of doctors to NSS volunteers who were going to be part of national cause. On 20 January, the day of pulse polio, NSS volunteer reached booth of their assigned area for service. Booth activity on Jan 20 was followed by house to house visits on 21<sup>st</sup> to 22<sup>nd</sup> by about 40 NSS volunteer of college. On the 21 Jan, 22 Jan the NSS volunteers went to every home and made sure that children who missed the pulse drops on Sunday were vaccinated with the help of NSS volunteers. During the house to house activity students mark each house for indicating that each child had taken the polio vaccine in this house. In addition to this campaign, save girl child stickers were pasted on each house under 'Save Girl Child Week' during the house to house visits in Pulse Polio Campaign.

### ***SEVEN DAYS NSS SPECIAL CAMP AT VILLAGE DADDU MAJRA (29-09-12 TO 5-10-12)***

Dev Samaj College of Education, Sector-36, Chandigarh, organized a seven days NSS camp at village 'Daddu Majra', Chandigarh (U.T.), from 29-09-12 to 5-10-12 under the guidance of NSS programme officers Dr. Richa Sharma and Mrs. Kiranjit Kaur. One hundred ninety five NSS volunteers participated in this seven days camp. The theme of the camp was 'Peace and Literacy'. The report of different days of the camp is given below:

#### ***Day 1 (29.9.2012)***

. The camp was inaugurated by organizing a visit of International delegates from China, Philippines, Afghanistan, Germany, Srilanka's Peace Ambassadors. On this occasion NSS volunteers presented the NSS song 'Uthe samaj ke liye uthe'. This was followed by an interactive session in which the Peace Ambassadors interacted with NSS volunteers and share their culture and gave stress on Peace and promoted Love, Peace and Brotherhood between the cultures. To make the International Delegates

## **22. Increase in the Infrastructural Facilities**

Paper -IV Part-B i.e. Computer Education is of total marks 40, out of which external theory is 20 marks and Practical is of 20 marks. The objectives of this subject are to understand different parts of computer and their functions, understand various computer applications, run different software on computer, familiarize student teachers with internet and its uses and to enable student teachers to use computer for enhancing teaching learning process. The practical component includes training in MS Windows: (Introduction, Parts, Start Menu, Task Bar settings, Application and document, Window, anatomy of window, Windows Explorer, desktop, icons, screen saver & settings). It also includes Use of following packages for processing word, evaluating numerical values & creating presentations (MS Word, MS Excel, MS PowerPoint). The student teachers are also expected to know Internet Surfing, working with E-mail & chatting. They also prepare a soft copy of lesson plan in power-point.

Teaching of Computer Education is of total marks 100, out of which external Theory is of 90 marks and internal assessment is of 10 marks. The objectives of this subject are to emphasize the need and importance of computer education as a subject, aware the pupils of different teaching methodologies for teaching of computer education, discuss the importance of computer curriculum and computer textbooks, teach the proper computer laboratory planning and to outline qualifications of computer staff, underline the need and importance of computerized lesson planning and its evaluation and to bring awareness regarding the practical and latest computer technology.

## **25. Financial Aid to Students**

The college offers helping hand to the poor students. The very poor students were given concession in their fee. They were also given free books from Book Bank. He urged the prospective teachers to spread awareness regarding the dreadful disease and inspired them to put self-less effort to serve the society. Red Ribbon, which is a symbol of solidarity and support towards the people living with HIV was also displayed by the students with the hope that this iconic image of the red ribbon will serve to raise awareness of HIV and AIDS across the city and help to reduce stigma and discrimination against people living with HIV.
