

DSCE: A Saga of Excellence

The Dev Samaj (a unique religious movement) was founded in 1887 by the Most Worshipful Bhagwan Dev Atma. The fundamental objective of Dev Samaj is to make us more and more capable of promoting the cause of unique life mission of Bhagwan Dev Atma i.e. propagation of Truth, Beauty and Goodness in thought; speech and action among all classes of people, irrespective of any consideration of caste, creed, colour and culture. The Dev Samaj endeavours to eradicate from the hearts of the people, as far as possible, such egoistic forces as vanity, hatred, self-will and selfishness and to evolve such altruistic feelings as compassion, gratitude, reverence etc. The Highest Evolution of mankind is the summum bonum of the Dev Dharma. Dev Samaj believes in the Science of moral and spiritual laws of soul. The Illustrious Founder set a golden example in his childhood when feeling strongly that education was as good for girls as for boys, he started teaching his two women relatives in the sixties of 19th century. At that time women education was considered superstitious breed involving the divine wrath. The venerable Founder of Dev Samaj realised that future of women lay in education. Education alone could open opportunity of enlightenment and independence for women. He wanted to regenerate mankind and transform society through women education. Bhagwan Dev Atma was the pioneer reformer who opened a High School for Girls at Ferozepur in 1901. The Dev Samaj Managing Council continued the educational work and at present the Dev Samaj Society is running about 22 educational institutions in the country. Prominent among them are located at Ferozepur, Moga, Ambala, Delhi and Chandigarh. These educational institutions hold a significant place on the educational map of Northern India. It is a matter of immense pride that the college has completed 35 years of its meritorious service to the country in general and to the Union Territory of Chandigarh in particular, in the field of women teacher education. We are extremely grateful to the Dev Samaj Managing Council and the Managing Committee for its generosity, valuable guidance and inspiration in discharging our responsibilities despite heavy odds and difficulties. It is hoped that with an inbuilt momentum, our institutions will continue to march onward to a better tomorrow in the service of the Nation.

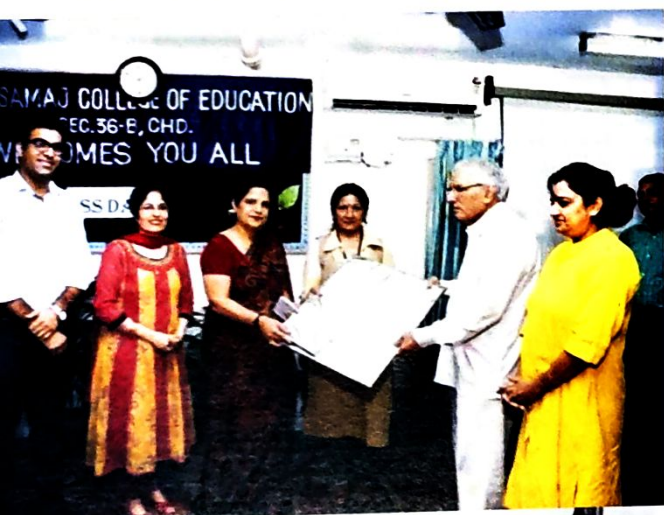

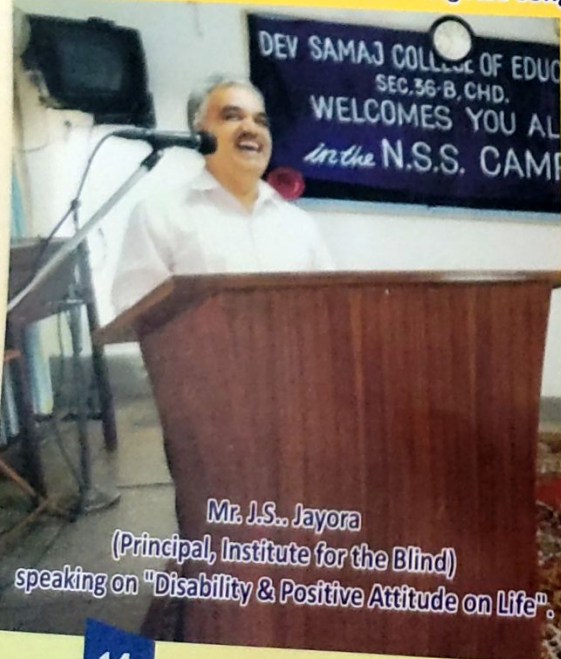

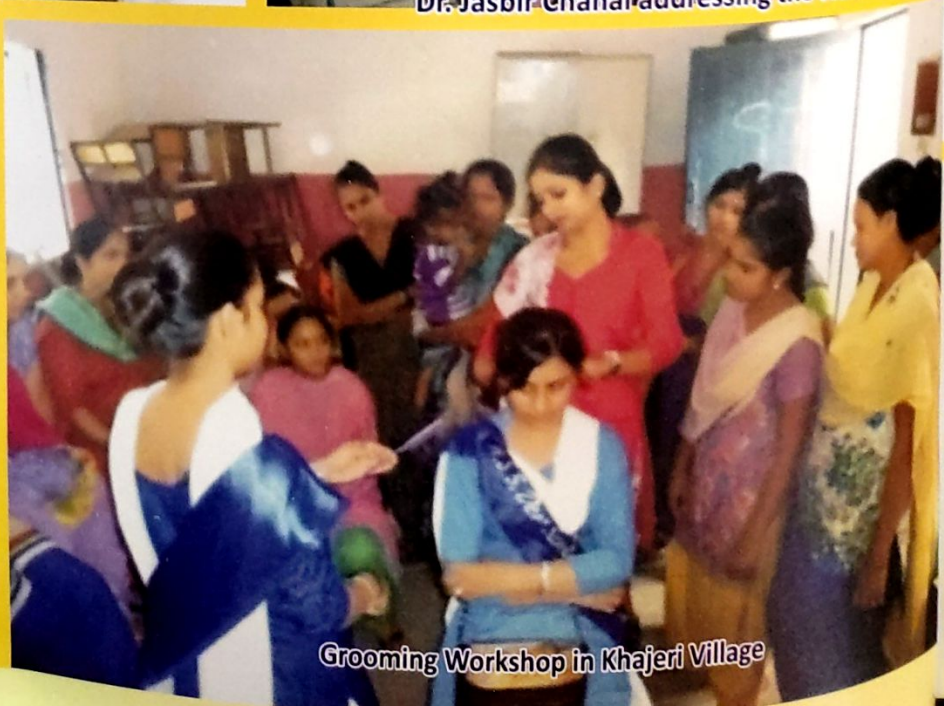

Swine Flu Awareness Survey (1.12.2015)

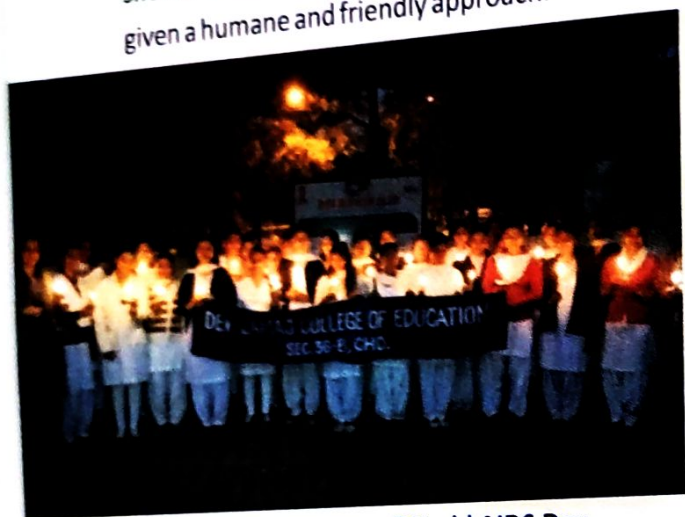

WORLD AIDS DAY(02.12.2015)

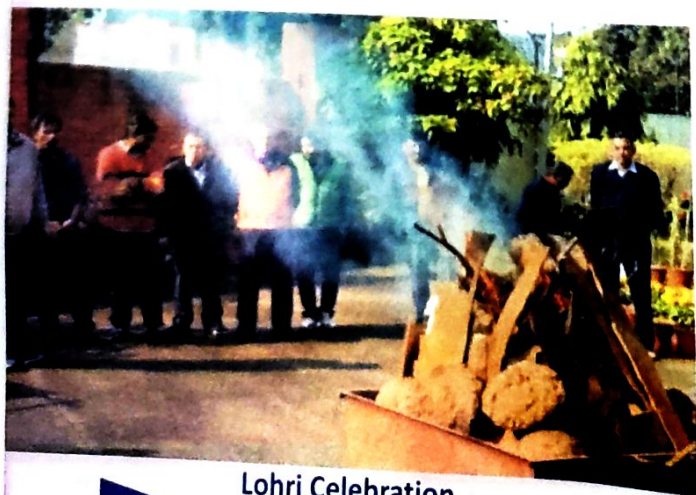

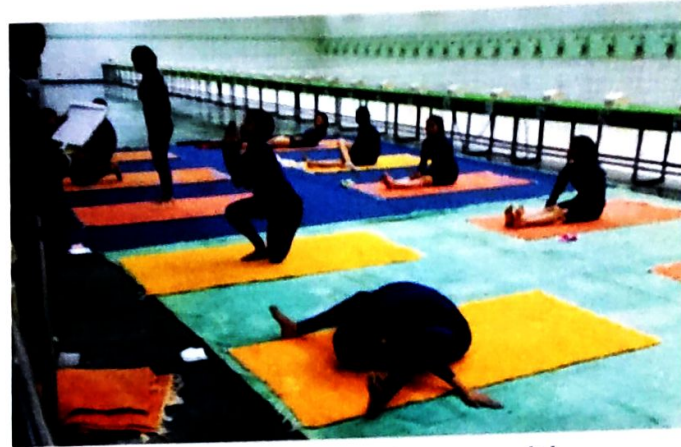

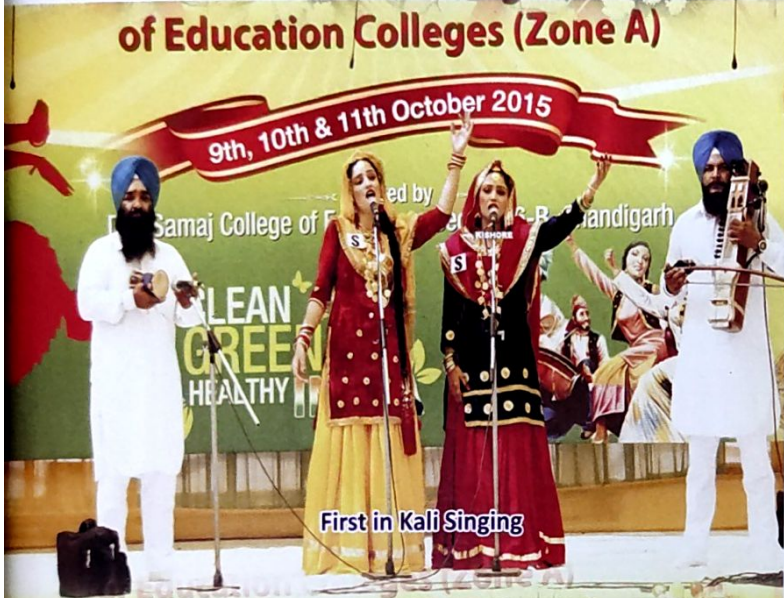

Inaugural Session

Pulse Polio Campaign (29.01.17)

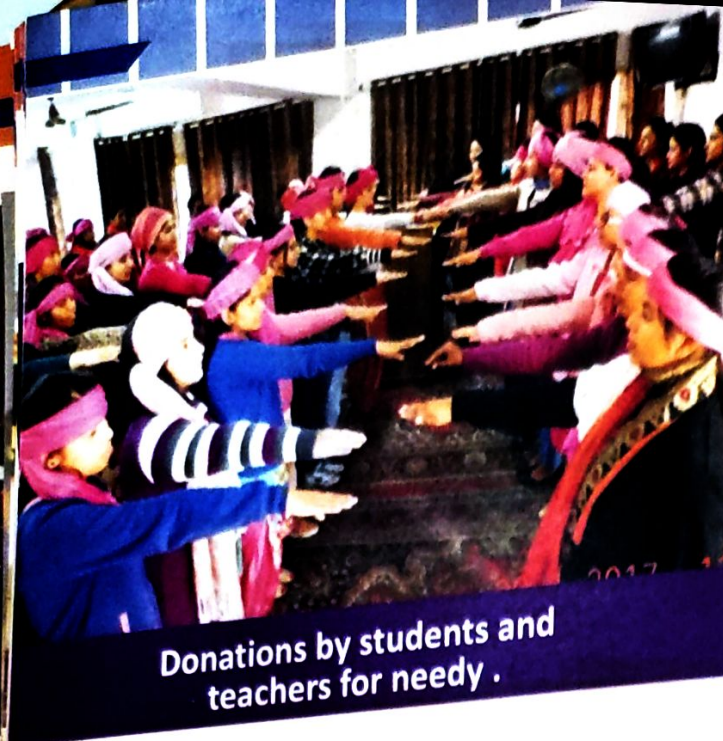

The workshop was held in three sessions: Inaugural session, First Technical Session and a Practical Session. It was presided by dignitaries Prof. Sonal Chawla, Dr. Sunil Dutt and Puneet Modgil. It was attended by teachers from various colleges of Chandigarh and students of the Dev Samaj College of Education Sec 36B, Chandigarh.

Dr. Dilip Kumar, ASPD, RUSA was the Chief Guest and Dr. Karamjeet Singh, Director HRDC, Panjab University, Chandigarh, Sh. Nirmal Singh Dhillon, Secretary Dev Samaj and Dr. Satinder Dhillon, former Principal were also present at the inaugural ceremony. Dr. Dilip Kumar enlightened the participants regarding the schemes of RUSA and highlighted the importance of research for the progress of any educational institution. Dr. Karamjeet while addressing the gathering spoke on various aspects like Knowledge and research that are needed for enlightened citizens. Sh. Nirmal Singh Dhillon, Secretary, Dev Samaj also motivated all the participants to learn and do better through such workshops. He emphasized on values that are needed to become a 'Man of Character'.

Moment means Interaction; Interaction and conversation with friends, peers, colleagues, professionals, guides and experience persons always enhance our knowledge and alert mind; Be conscious, realistic, alert, active and caring.

Day 1 (Session 1)

Dr. Dilip Kumar congratulated and appreciated Dev Samaj College of Education for two important reasons i.e. Accredited by NAAC with grade 'A' and imparting quality education. He further complimented the college for choosing the best topic that is "Capacity Building of Teachers." He elaborated on the three main dimensions which are the requirement of the hour i.e. Research Dimensions, Cultural and Value Dimensions and Skill Dimensions. In research dimensions MHRD's thrust areas are Reform in curriculum (Curriculum Re-construction), Research in higher education. 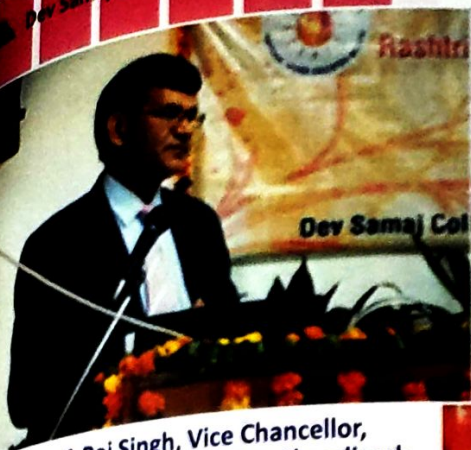

On the fourth day Prof. Raj Singh, Vice Chancellor, RayatBahra University, Chandigarh conducted a workshop on "Becoming Relevant and Effective through Self Awareness". He explicated the importance of being educated, not just qualified. On concluding day of Seven Days Faculty Development workshop on "Capacity Building of Teachers: Strengthening the Edifice" under the aegis of Rashtriya Uchchatar Shiksha Abhiyan (RUSA), Prof. B.S Ghuman, Dean Faculty of Arts, Panjab University spoke on "How to write a research proposal / project". He elaborated on the various parameters of writing a research proposal - its funding, opening remarks, objectives, research design, budget, synopsis, content etc.

He gave two important concepts to be covered (1) Importance of Research and research writing and (2) How to write good funding proposal/ project. 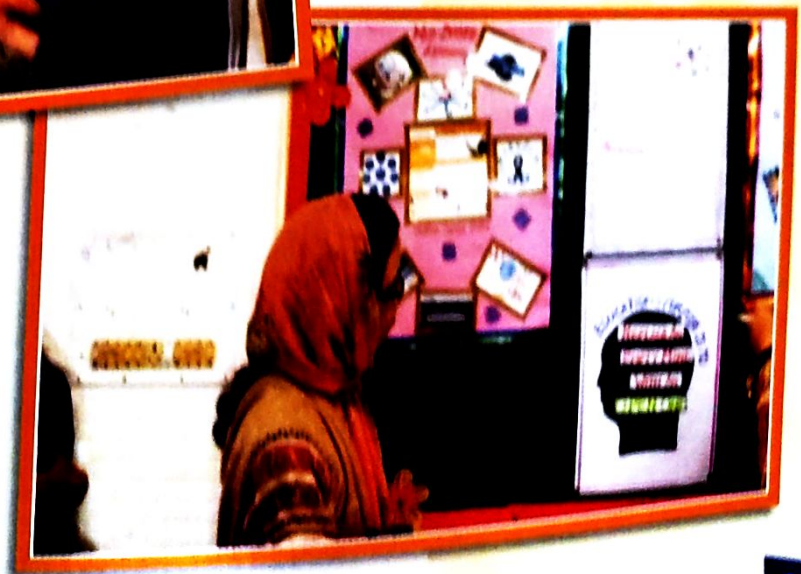

 - To encourage students to use herbs in food.



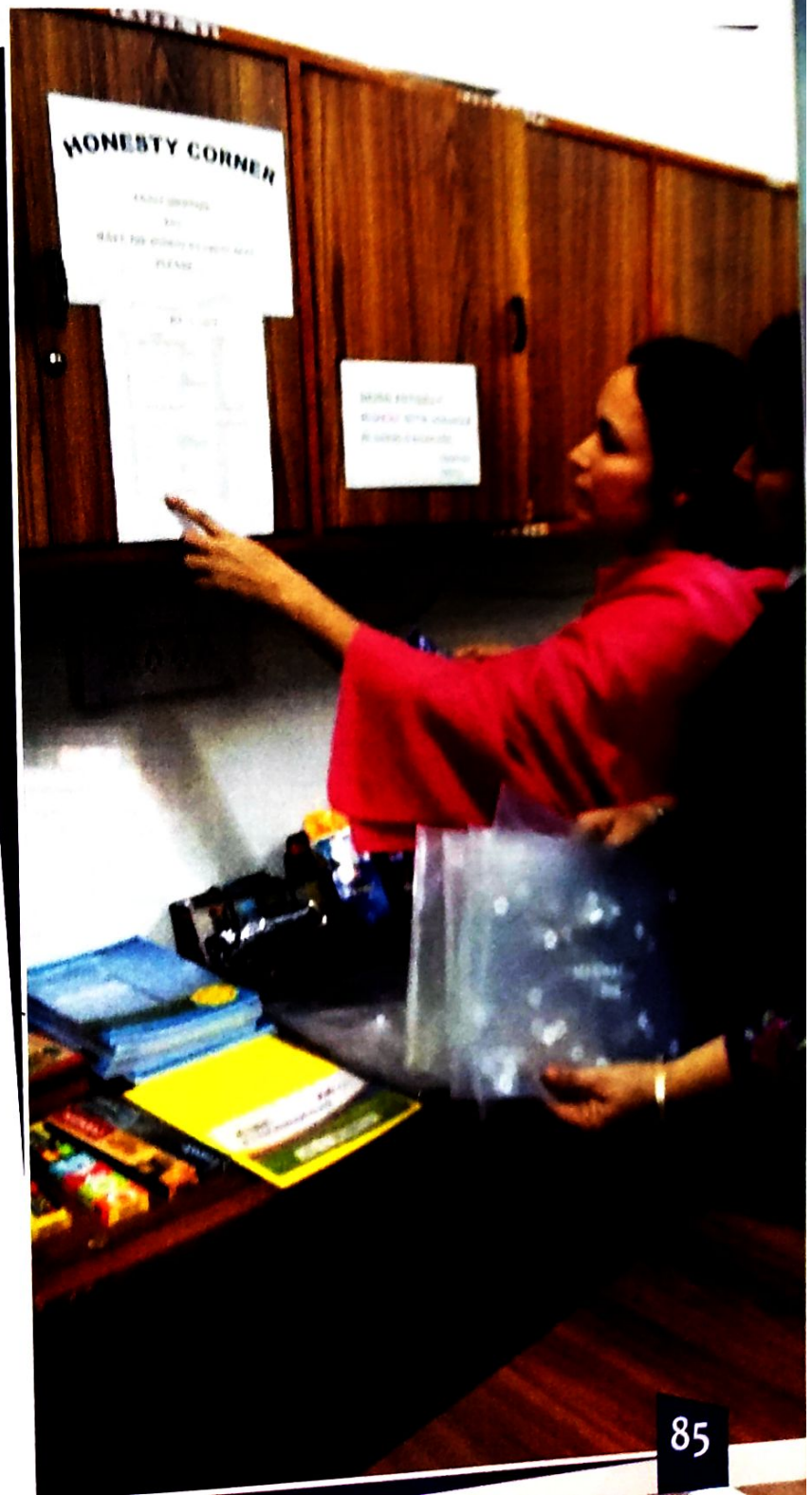
HONESTY CORNER

SCHOOL ON THE MOVE

On 11th November 2009, to mark the National Education Day on the Birth Anniversary of an eminent educationist Maulana Abul Kalam Azad, a novel and experimental scheme of taking school to the underprivileged sections of the society "School on the Move" was introduced by NSS units of the college. Motivated by Azad's selfless working attitude, Principal of the college took this grand initiative in the Union Territory of Chandigarh by opening a mobile school named "School On The Move" first of its kind, which is built in a bus that is equipped fully just like a classroom with attractive and colourful teaching aids and a blackboard. School on the Move was inaugurated by Sh. Prem Singh, Sarpanch, of the village Buterla. In his address to the gathering, he appreciated the novel idea of the college that would benefit the underprivileged sections of the society. Referring to Mobile school as rare and lifetime opportunity, he requested the villagers to avail the opportunity. The residents of Buterla village who took keen interest in enrolling themselves were provided with free books, note books and stationery. The enrolled members comprised of different age groups. The purpose of the Mobile School is not just to teach the underprivileged children basic reading and writing skills, but also to help them learn that they deserved a better life. They would be given time to develop self-esteem and slowly prepare themselves to lead a better and improved life. Enthusiastic gathering of more than hundred residents of Buterla village appreciated and thanked the efforts taken by the college and for selecting Buterla as a first village for the purpose.

Objective of the Practice

To serve the needs of underprivileged children in rural areas

Need Addressed and the Context.

Dev Samaj College of Education is located in the heart of Union Territory of Chandigarh, surrounded by a number of small villages. It may not always be possible to bring children to the school, so, a novel and experimental scheme of taking the school to the children has been introduced by the college in Buterla village. It is to take

education to doorstep to children who either can't go to school or have dropped out because of various reasons. It also serves the needs elderly people especially women. It is a mobile school built into a bus that is equipped fully as a classroom with attractive and colourful teaching aids and a blackboard. The goal isn't just to teach them basic reading and writing skills, but also to help them learn that they deserve a better life. They're given time to develop self-esteem and slowly prepare themselves for life off the streets, or if that isn't possible, at least make their life on the streets more humane.

The Practice

The first school of its kind in the region, the "School on the Move", goes to a village named Buterla in the vicinity of Chandigarh, the first village to start with. After completing three years in village Buterla now the 'School on the Move' goes to village Dadu Majra as it is the adopted village of the college under NSS. The student teachers of the college go to teach the underprivileged children as well as women of the village. They are provided with free books, transcription note books and stationery for practice. They are taught not only the three r's but also other life skills like Henna applying, paper bag making, candle making, rangoli etc. that help them in earning an extra income for the family. More than 50 students come daily and they are being taught according to their requirements as some are interested in learning how to write their names so that they could do their signatures instead of thumb impression others are interested in helping their children in their homework so they are more keen in reading English text books especially their wards class texts. The group also includes children those who are already going to school but need extra help. The overwhelming response of the villagers motivates the college to adopt more villages for the purpose and to open more mobile schools in the area. Awareness and sensitization programmes on Aids, leprosy, environment, energy conservation, safe blood donation, immunisation and vaccination etc. are also included through theme based movies, lectures by experts and by distributing informative brochures.
