Education alone could open opportunity of enlightenment and independence for women. He wanted to regenerate mankind and transform society through women education. Bhagwan Dev Atma was the pioneer reformer who opened a High School for Girls at Ferozpur in 1901. The Dev Samaj Managing Council continued the educational work and at present the Dev Samaj Society is running about 22 educational institutions in the country. Prominent among them are located at Ferozpur, Moga, Ambala, Delhi and Chandigarh. These educational institutions hold a significant place on the educational map of Northern India. It is a matter of immense pride that the college has completed 38 years of its meritorious service to the country in general and to the Union Territory of Chandigarh in particular, in the field of women teacher education. 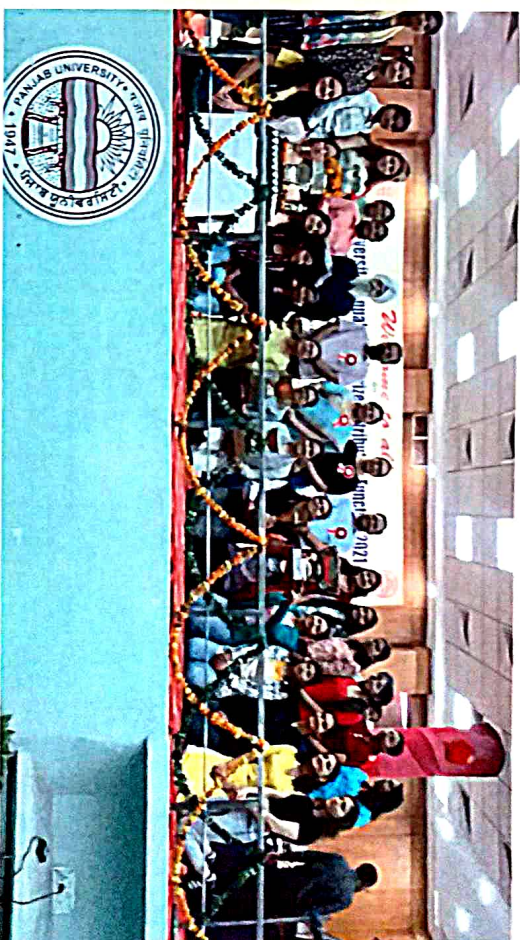

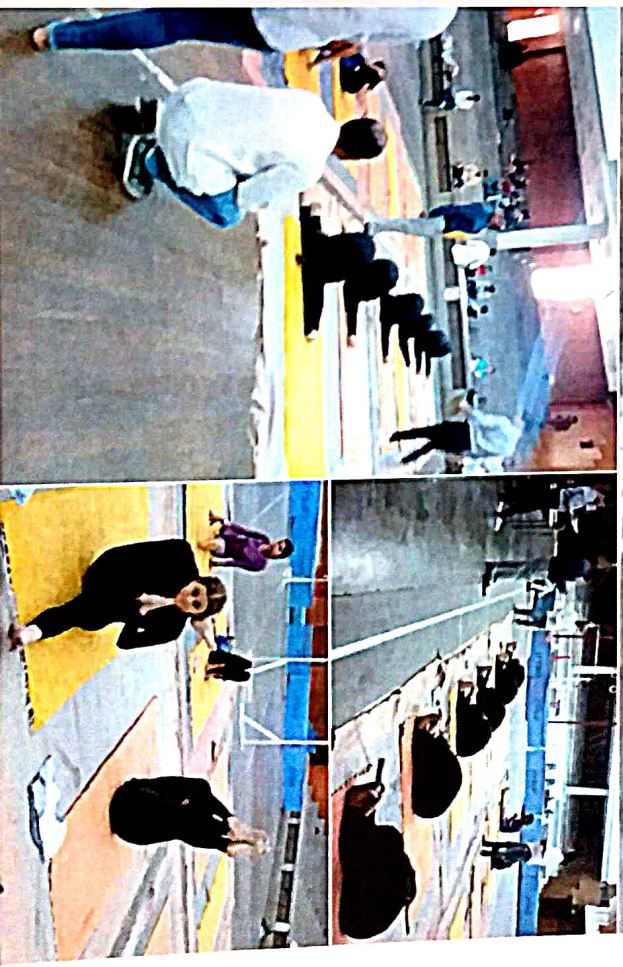


Gold Medal In Punjab University Table Tennis Inter college Competition.

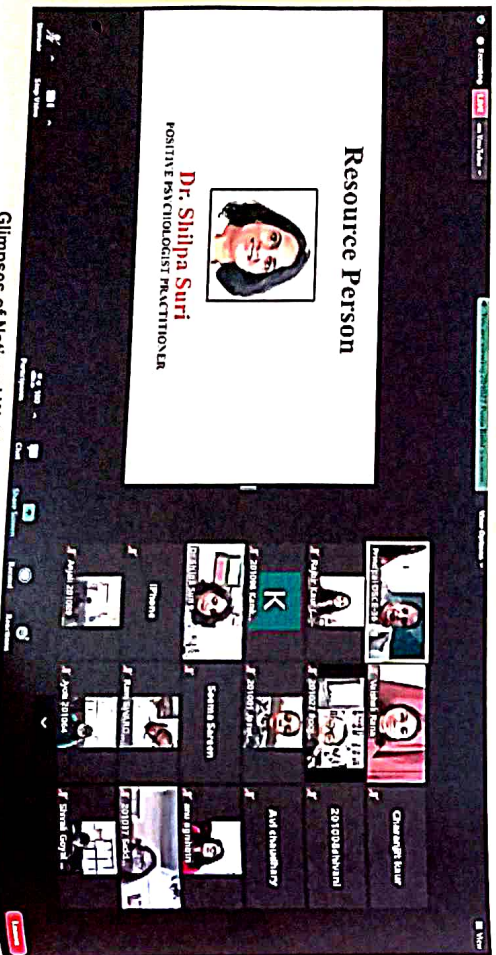
NATIONAL WEBINAR 'Mindfulness - A way of life' (16-10-2021)

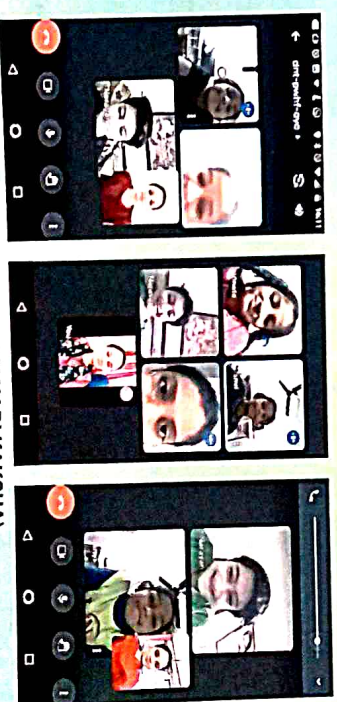

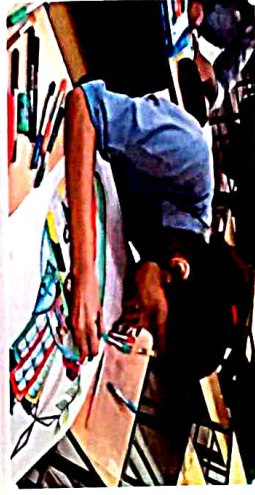

Day 2 of the workshop began by learning about performing intelligence as well as personality tests. Students also learnt technicalities about aptitude testing.

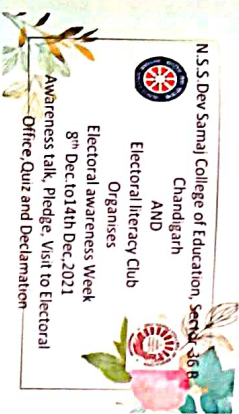

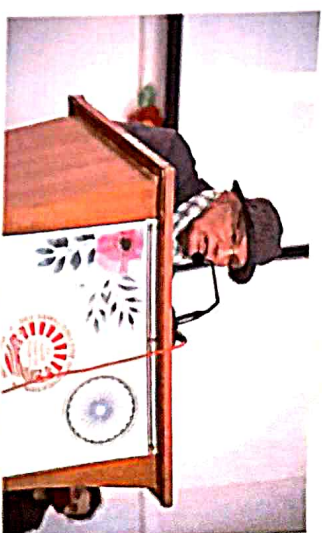

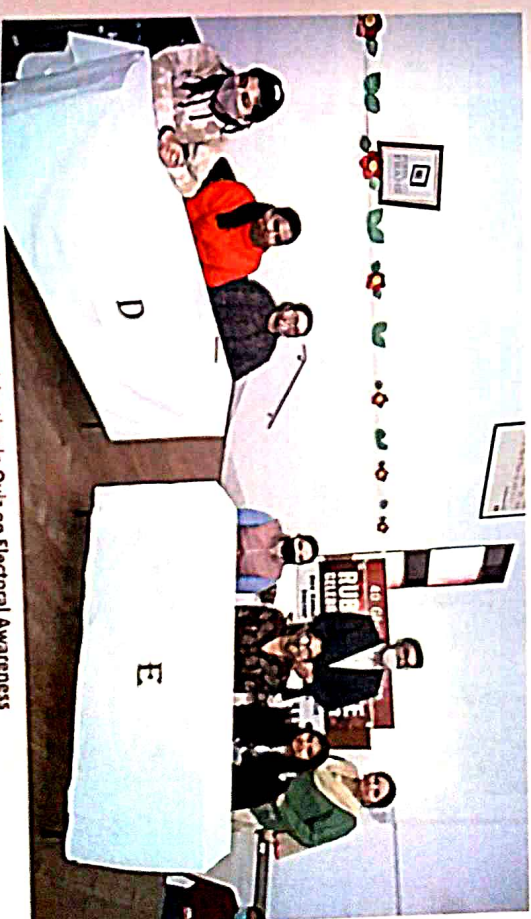
Q uiz on Electoral Awareness was organized during "Electoral Literacy Week"

Eco-Skill Development Workshop

On the same day eco-skill development workshop was organized to promote eco-friendly approach towards waste management and disposal. The resource person of the workshop was Ms. Samridha Bansal (Campaign Director Delhi NCR/ Chandigarh Tricity & Punjab of Green Karma & Associates). She demonstrated a hard copy catalogue in which she displayed about different types of wastes and also motivated them for adopting eco- friendly practices by eliminating usage of plastic bags. The resource person also advised the practice of waste segregation by keeping separate bins for dry and wet waste of kitchen. This was followed by demonstration of general waste management techniques and homemade organic manure. Homemade compost was made using sandwich method in which kitchen waste was spread on dry leaves in the earthen pot, wet kitchen waste in the middle and then a layer of dry leaves on the top again. Major components used in this process were carbon, oxygen, nitrogen and moisture.

The main aim of the workshop was to manage the waste by throwing less amount of waste in dump pits, recycling kitchen waste into productive manures and lessening the work of rag pickers.

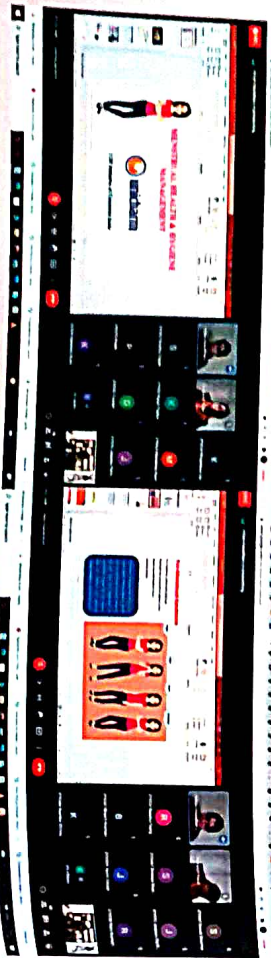
LOHRI CELEBRATION (13.01.2022)

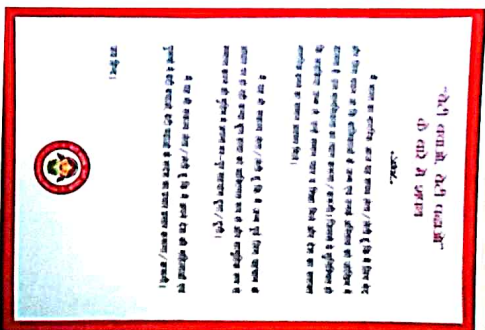
WORKSHOP ON MENSTRUAL HYGIENE (22.01.2022)

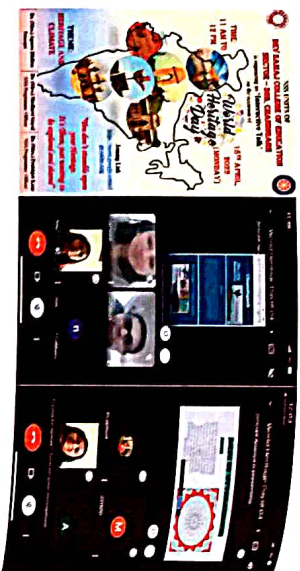

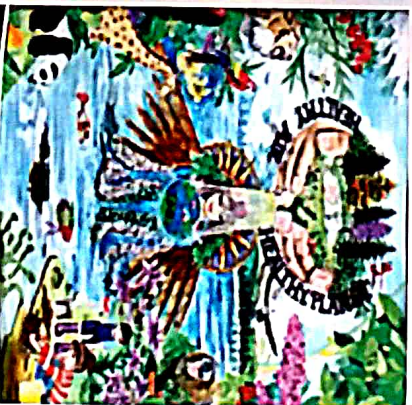

Detective Training Institute was the resource person for this workshop. He highlighted the need of becoming aware of misuses of technology and to avoid being a victim of such crimes in today's era. The students were told about the legal aspects of accessing the internet and using virtual life judiciously. Several case studies were shared with the audience and they were further sensitized towards privacy and security of data. Five values which include responsibilities, respect, compassion, resilience and integrity were emphasized and cyber laws of India were shared with students.

The resource person presented live hacking demonstrations and made them aware about various ways likewise two-step verification, comment control, using a strong password etc. that can be adopted in order to avoid cyber crimes. Most people are at least semi-aware that identify theft and network hacks are possible, and are reasonably good at not intentionally downloading malicious code or clicking dubious links. It is also common for organizations to implement firewalls, comprehensive IT defense systems and IT policies and protocols to keep themselves safe from online threats. He also mentioned that Cyber security awareness can help the students and faculty understand how they can be easily targeted by cyber-crime, and the steps they can take when they fall a victim. This goes beyond simply being conscious of potential threats, but provides students with the hands-on knowledge of how cyber-crime works, what internal prevention policies are and why they exist, and what is expected of them moving forward.

He concluded the session by sharing some tips for internet banking, using social networking apps and safe online transactions. He shared the names of different websites and applications launched by the government of India for reporting and avoiding cyber crimes. At the end, he also welcomed and reverted back to the queries raised by the students and faculty members.

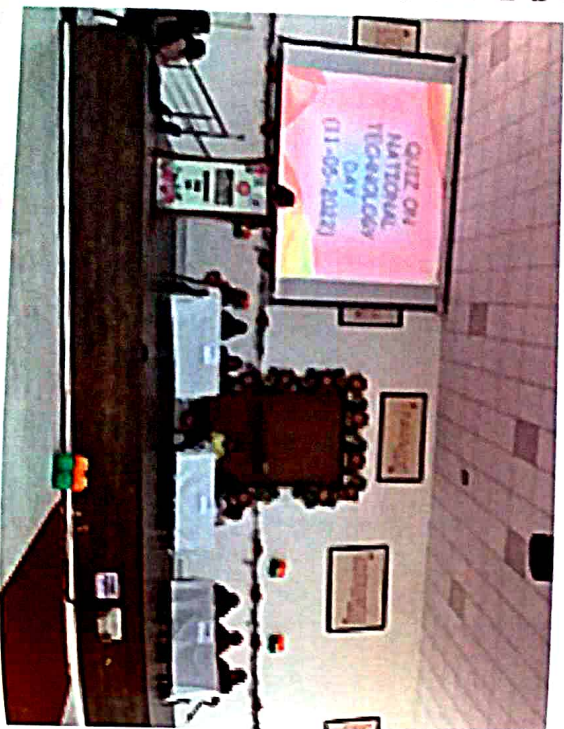
