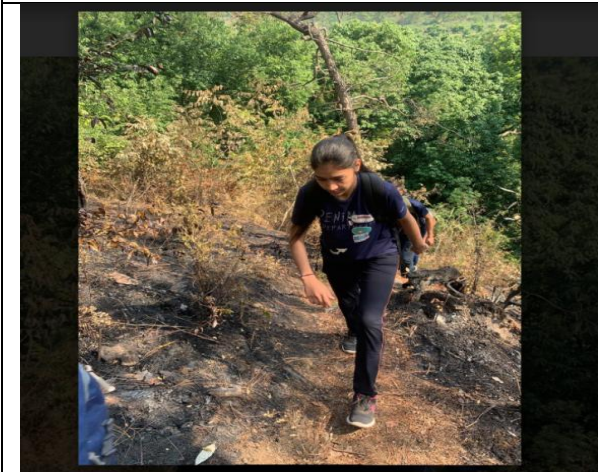
### **DAY 8 (23-06-2019)**

### **1) Extension Lecture by Dr. Neeru Malik at Doraha College, Doraha on 4<sup>th</sup> April 2019**

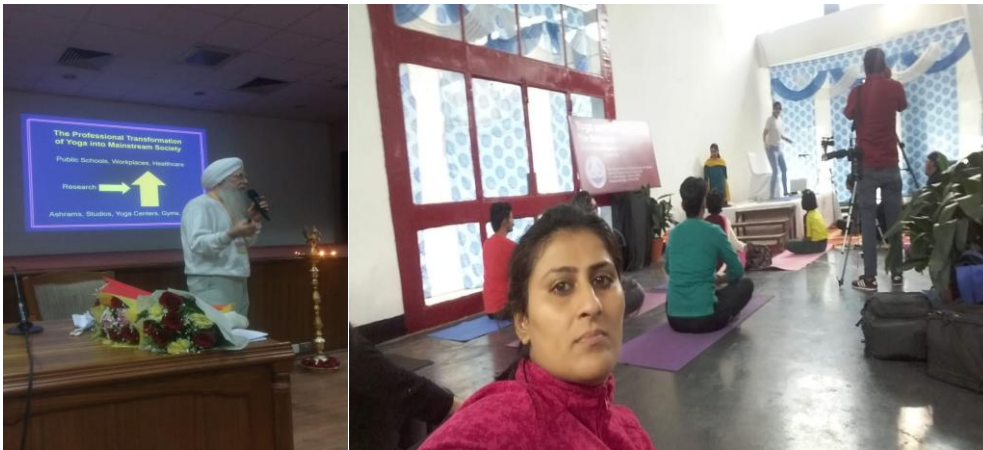

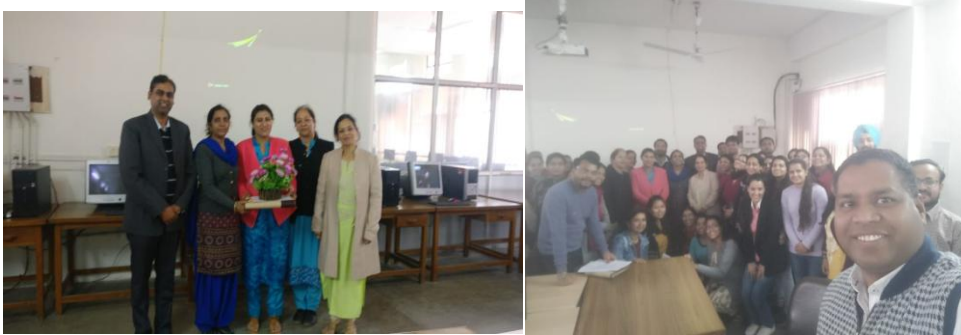
## 2) Workshop and Lecture Series at PGIMER on 25<sup>th</sup> March 2019

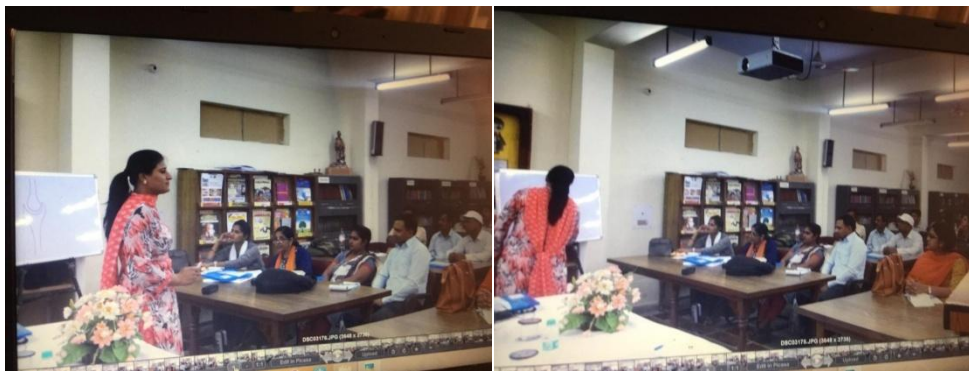

### **Activity 2: AWARENESS OF RAIN WATER HARVESTING IN THE COLLEGE CAMPUS**

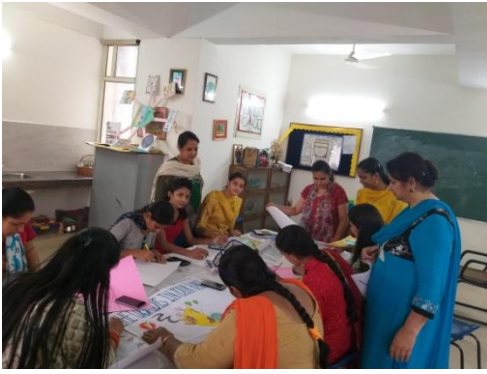

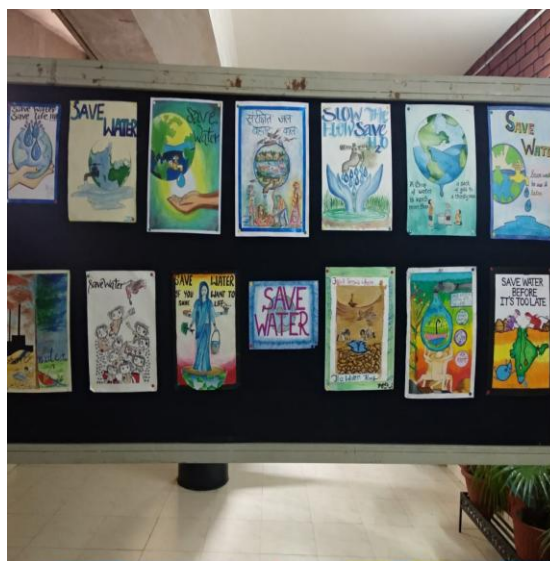


### In Govt. Schools-

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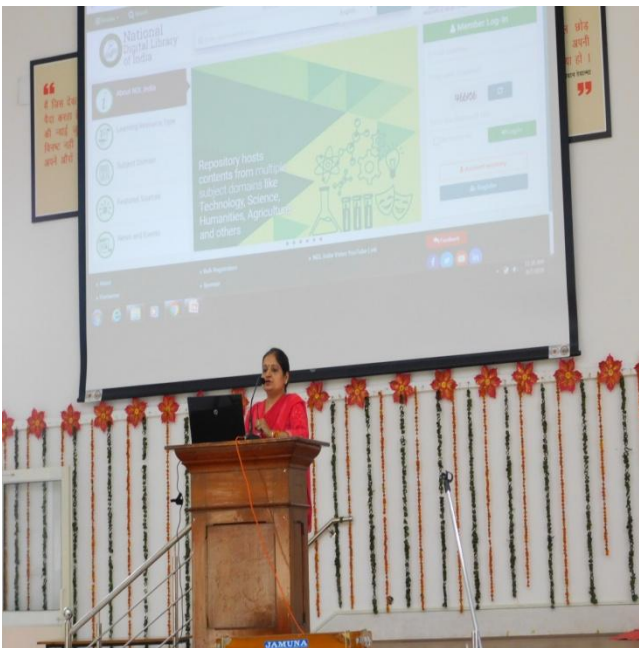

### **A LECTURE ON “EATING DISORDER AND THE IMPORTANCE OF BALANCED DIET”**

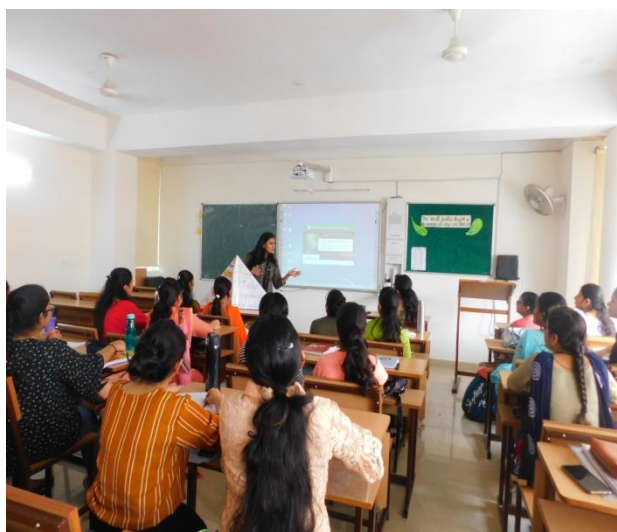

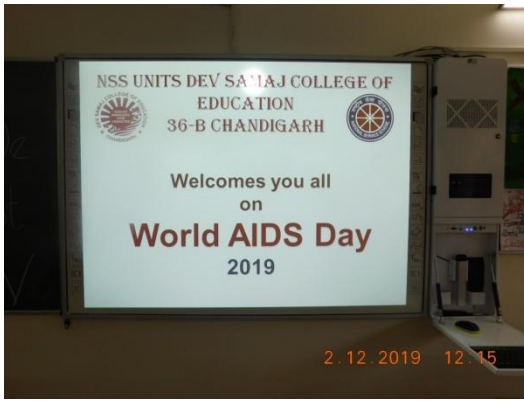


The event was concluded with the prize distribution where Principal ma'am congratulated the winners along with the NSS Units for the success of the event.

Each group was assigned the work to Polio Vaccination Procedure. Dr. Gurpreet Kaur gave the full details to students about how to immunize child and maintain /update records with self.

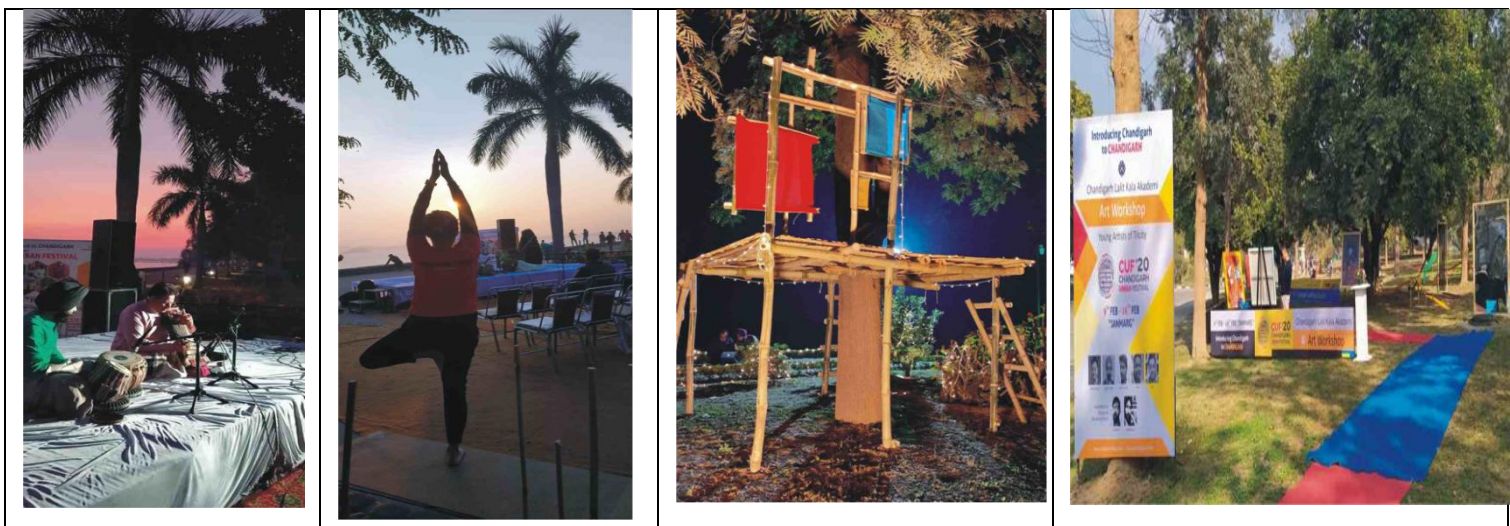

## SCREENING OF FILM

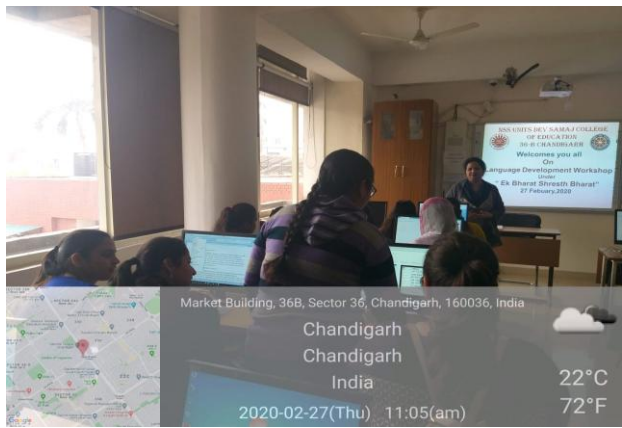
