Celebration of Important Days

Sadbhavna divas and Akshay Urja divas: August 20, 2010

Another resource person Stanzin Dawa, Programme Manager with Commonwealth Youth Asia Centre laid stress on easily adoptable Peace & Conflict Resolution techniques. Senior freelance journalist Vandana Shukla shared with teachers that today the world is multi-cultural, multi-religious and multi-ethnic and so no country can be monocultural, mono-religious and mono-ethnic.

2. Multi skill development for effective teaching: Two day orientation-cum training programme for teachers of Sarv Shiksha Abhiyan (Panjab): October 13 to November 2, 2010

Two day orientation cum training programme on "*Multi Skill Development for Effective Teaching*" for teachers of "SARV SHIKSHA ABHIYAN, PUNJAB" was organized at the college from 13th October to 2nd November 2010. Nearly 270 Government School teachers and English Master Trainers were trained in the different skills namely team building for effective management and group exercises, motivational skills to create a motivational climate, techniques to cope with examination stress, remedial teaching for diagnostic testing , training in English Language Laboratory for soft skills in communication and ICT in teaching learning process. He highly appreciated the quality of the training and the efforts made by the college.

3. Seminar-cum-Workshop on “Stress Management among Adolescents”:

February 10, 2011

NSS units of the college organised “one-day Seminar-cum-Workshop on Stress Management among Adolescents” in collaboration with the state NSS-Cell, Chandigarh Administration. The Chief Guest on the occasion was Dr. Ajit Avasthi, Head of Dept. Of Psychiatry, P.G.I.M.E.R Chd. In his Key note address, Dr. Avasthi elaborated on the meaning, stages and techniques of coping with stress. This was followed by an interactive cum training session. ‘Preksha Meditation Techniques’ during which various techniques were demonstrated by Ms. Namrata Kapoor, Lecturer, GMSSS, Sector 47, Chandigarh. Dr. Harpreet Kanwal Chhabra, Chairperson, Deptt of Psychology, Panjab University discussed the causes of stress at the cognitive, behavioural and emotional levels of the students and teachers.

In the afternoon session, the participants evinced keen interest in the absorbing lecture with the mention of modernized techniques of stress management like the Jacobson Muscle Relaxation techniques demonstrated by Dr. Ritu Nehra, Assistant Professor, Clinical Psychology, Deptt. of Psychiatry, P.G.I.M.E.R Chd. Dr.(Mrs.) Neeru Malik Asst.Prof, of the college gave an enlightening talk on regaining energy through sports and recreation as a medium of stress relief. An interesting way of stress reduction by the way of Visual Imagination and Art Therapy was highlighted by Dr.(Mrs.) Richa Sharma, Assistant Professor of the college. Mrs. Charanjeet Kaur, lecturer of the college focussed on fun activities for bursting Stress.

Sh. Arjun Dev, Registrar, Education Department, UT Administration, Chandigarh was the chief guest on the valedictory function of the seminar. In his address, Sh. Arjun Dev appreciated the efforts of the college and also suggested to “prioritize things” as a mantra to distress to lead a simple and stress free life. Sh. Bikram Rana, State Liaison Officer, U.T. Chandigarh was the guest of honour on the occasion. In his interaction with the participants, he inspired and motivated the adolescents to implement the techniques in their daily life that they had learnt in this workshop. The first issue of the research journal titled “Journal of education” was also released on the occasion. The programme concluded with the distribution of certificates to the participants.

Day 1: Dec 14, 2010

The Guest of honour was Kumari Satyawati Ji, Chairperson, of the college. She released the Annual College Magazine "DIV DIPTI" on the occasion. The Program Officers, Dr. Seema Sareen and Dr. Anita Nangia gave an overview of the activities to be conducted during the week which include Legal Awareness Drive , Literacy Drive , AIDS Awareness Rally , Sensitization Programmes on Leprosy, Adult Education Drive , Blood Donation Camp , Vaccination Camp, Free Medical Checkup and Training on Disaster Management etc. A song, a Skit and a Dance item was performed by the NSS volunteers of the college.

Visit to Buterla Village

In the afternoon session, NSS volunteers visited the adopted village 'Buterla'. They interacted with the villagers and know about their requirements. They also interacted with the children and women in the 'school on the move'. Programme officers formed groups of the volunteers and duties were assigned to these groups.

Workshop on Team Building

In the evening a workshop on "Team Building" was conducted by Dr. Batani Devi and Dr. Anita Nangia through which the students were introduced to various

components of team building and they were also made to realise the importance of team building through an activity named, "Mine Field" – based on communication and trust. The day concluded by the cultural programme presented by NSS volunteers. The whole group participated in the cultural programme.

Day 2: December 15, 2010

The second day of the seven days NSS Camp at Butrela village by the NSS volunteers began with a survey to gather information about their basic requirements. There was a lot of enthusiasm and vigour among the volunteers to be a part of a social cause. A session on Legal Awareness, emphasizing on Women Rights and their issues was discussed by Advocate (Mrs.) Shefali Kataria. A Literacy Rally was carried out to generate consciousness among the people about the significance of education. Various activities like crafts, stitching, knitting etc. were conducted during the day.

Day 3: December 16, 2010

The third day of the Camp at Butrela village began with a seminar on Drug De-addiction by the Alcoholics Anonymous Society. Pamphlets were distributed and slogans were raised by the NSS volunteers to generate consciousness among the residents of the village.

Fifteen youth delegates from some Commonwealth Nations also took part in an Aids Awareness Rally as a part of their leadership training program along with the NSS volunteers.

Day 4: December 17, 2010

The 4th day of the Camp began with the 'Free Eye Care Cum Check Up Camp' which was organized in collaboration with PGI, Chandigarh. A group of doctors from PGI visited the place and around 150 patients got their eyes checked and a large majority of them were found to be suffering from the various ailments such as cataract, near vision, and retinal problems etc

In order to inculcate love & compassion for the animals, the NSS volunteers also organized an enlightening talk by the social workers from 'Society for the prevention of cruelty to animals' (SPCA), Chandigarh. Volunteers participated in the vaccination drive for stray animals. A rally was carried out by the NSS volunteers to provide the villagers with the knowledge of birth control methods. They said that a slower growth rate in population would significantly place lesser strain on natural resources besides reducing the financial burden of the family which will result in families with good shelter, opportunities for healthy living etc.

Day 5: December 17, 2010

The 5th day of the Camp began with the motivational talk on Blood donation by Dr. Vineeta, member of Rotary Club Society, Sector-37, Chandigarh. She emphasized on the importance of donating blood for the needy people and clarified the misconceptions and myths of the people regarding blood donation. Ms. Anita Arora and Dr. Anuradha Agnihotri, members of the Blood Bank Society propagated the message to be a part of the noble cause. A Literacy program took place to generate awareness among the adults about the significance of education. Various activities like crafts, stitching, knitting etc. were conducted during the day.

Day 6: December 19, 2010

Blood donation camp organised

As a part of the ongoing NSS camp, a Blood Donation Camp was organized the college in collaboration with Blood Bank Society Sector 37 and Rotary Club. 21. Computerization of Administration and the Process of Admissions and Examination Results

Office Administration is fully computerized through Tally, MS-office, Photoshop and Internet. The college has a well furnished Computer lab with 11 computers. Each year more computers are added. In session 2010-11, 4 computers were upgraded in the computer lab. In this session E-Beam, a technology to bring interactivity at any surface was purchased for providing the environment of smart classrooms in the college.
