It was presented by the students of class VI and VII.

They cited common office scenario where it is a huge task to get work done without greasing palms of the concerned officials. 2. New Academic Programmes Initiated (UG AND PG):

A 3-6 months Certificate course in Human Rights approved by UGC, affiliated by Panjab University, Chandigarh was started from session 2012-13. In this session an attempt will be made to strengthen and popularise the programme among students.

Launch of IGNOU Programme Study Centre

Dev Samaj College of Education, Sector 36-B, Chandigarh launched its first IGNOU Programme Study Centre (Code-06016P) in Chandigarh from the session 2013-14. Dr. D.B. Negi, Sr. Regional Director IGNOU RC, Chandigarh and Dr. Joginder Kumar Yadav, Deputy Regional Director IGNOU inaugurated the centre for B.Ed. , MA Education, PG Diploma in Educational Technology & Certificate course in Guidance. In an interactive session with programme incharge Dr. (Mrs.) Agnese Dhillon and the faculty members, Dr. D.B. Negi said that the B.Ed programme offered by IGNOU is an innovative programme utilizing self instructional material and Information Technology along with interactive Personal Contact Programme.

The programme is a judicious mix of theoretical and practical course in order to develop the practicing teacher's knowledge, skills, understanding and attitudes. He also stated the objectives of the B.Ed. course through open and distance learning. This newly opened centre will cater to the needs of in-service teachers who want to pursue B.Ed. course side by side in the tricity as well as neighboring states. Now, the benefits of highly qualified faculty and efficient infrastructure of Dev Samaj College of Education, Sector 36-B, Chandigarh will not be restricted to the regular students but will also be extended to in-services teachers enrolled for various courses in IGNOU.

2. Innovations in Curricular Design and Transaction

4. Inter-disciplinary programmes

The college is single faculty (Education) with different subjects. A 3-6 months Certificate course in Human Rights approved by UGC, affiliated by Panjab University, Chandigarh was started from session 2012-13 which is purely

interdisciplinary. In this session an attempt will be made to strengthen and popularise the programme among students.

Apart from this, many interdisciplinary lectures are organised from time to time which prove beneficial for all the faculty members. The ones that were conducted during this year were:

Lecture on “ Construction of Words”(4.10.2013)

The college organized a lecture by Sh. O. P. Dhingra, Assistant Director, Haryana Education Department on “ Construction of Words”. Mr. O. P. Dhingra held an interactive session accompanied with fun filled activities such as scrabble, puzzles, crosswords. The students were provided with challenging worksheets from easiest to difficult with the ultimate aim of improving vocabulary. This session was thoroughly enjoyed by the students.

Expert lecture on “What does a Woman want?” (8.3.13)

An expert lecture was delivered by Mrs. Charanjit Kaur to mark International Women’s Day on the theme “What does a Women want?” She also narrated a story with a moral ‘Let the Women be incharge of her own life’. She asked the prospective teachers to be self-supportive so as to take important decisions of the life they also motivated the volunteers by saying that women play a vital role in creating a peaceful society. 5. Examination Reforms Implemented

The college conducts internal house tests twice a year as per the university rules The college also conducts class tests and snap tests from time to time to make the students face the annual examinations with confidence. The question papers set for the house tests are on the pattern of the University examination. Internal assessment is also given on the basis of marks in these tests as per university rules.

The following examination reforms were implemented:

- Continuous Comprehensive Evaluation was done throughout the year assessing the students' performance in scholastic and co-scholastic areas.
- The internal assessment system and student attendance was made fully transparent and it was displayed on the notice boards.
- The mistakes committed during the exams were brought to the notice of the students, which enabled them to identify and rectify those mistakes in the university examinations.
- The whole examination process is done under the guidance of the examination committee.
- Question banks containing long and short answer questions were provided to students so as to give them better preparations for exams.

1. National Seminar on "Technology should be the servant, not the Master"
(11.10.2013)

Dev Samaj College of Education ,Chandigarh organized “2nd CLA National Seminar on “Libraries in Digital Era” in association with Chandigarh Librarians’ Association. The seminar was inaugurated by Sh. Pawan Kumar Bansal, Member of Parliament, Chandigarh. While addressing the gathering of more than 200 delegates Sh. Pawan Kumar Bansal, said that the Libraries in their traditional form will continue to remain an important source of education even in this age of advanced technology. Mr. Bansal wanted the Librarians to give importance to creation of proper Library environment for their readers. He cautioned the Librarians not to allow the technology to become their master rather they should use it for the better management of their Libraries.

On this occasion, a seminar volume edited by Dr.P. Venkata Rao, Dr. Preeti Sharda and Dr. Jaspal Kaur was released by Sh. Pawan Kumar Bansal.

Delivering the key note address in this seminar Prof. Jagtar Singh, Head, Department of Library and Information Science, Panjabi University, Patiala reminded the Librarians that technology is good so far as the functional areas of library services were concerned but there is dire need for establishing relationship with their readers. He exhorted the librarians to use the technology for the benefit of their readers.

Sh. Nirmal Singh Dhillon, Secreatry Dev Samaj lauded the importance of books in one’s life. He wanted the Librarians to maintain the traditional library system.

Dr. (Mrs.) Jyoti Khanna, Principal, Dev Samaj College and Mrs. Neelam Nagpal, President, CLA welcomed the chief guest. Giving a brief about the Chandigarh Librarians’ association, Dr.(Mrs) Jaspal Kaur, General Secretary talked about the programmers and activities organized by CLA during its 25 years journey and its role in bringing awareness among students, parents and teachers about the value of library oriented education in addition to the programmes of professional development of Librarians.

The seminar Director Mr. I.B. Verma giving details of the seminar said that the Daylong seminar was spread over three technical sessions chaired by Dr.V.K. Anand, Librarian, RGNUL, Patiala, Mr. Prem Chand, Librarian, IAS, Shimla. Dr. D.V. Singh Former President Indian Library Association, Delhi chaired the special session on School Libraries. In all seventeen papers were presented in three technical sessions.

Presiding over the valedictory programme Dr. (Mrs.) Ashu Shokeen advised the Librarians to have inter and intra organizations collaboration in addition to application of Information Technology in all library operations.

Mr. S.K. Sood, Rapporteur General read out the proceedings and recommendations of the seminar. The seminar ended with a vote of thanks by Dr. Mrs. Jaspal Kaur, General Secretary, CLA and Dr. P.V. Rao, Senior Vice President.

2. National Seminar on “Learning to teach: Preparation and Quality Deliverance”, (19.3. 2014)

The college organised an ICSSR, P.U sponsored national seminar on the theme mentioned above in which Key Note Address was presented by Dr. Vandana Mehra, Chairperson, Panjab University, Department of Education. Dr. Vandana Mehra shared her vast experiences on the quality development in education. She told how we can improve the curriculum of teacher education. She emphasised that according to NCFT, we have to learn and accept the challenges of the teaching preparation and prepare professional teachers. Then she told about that what should the future of teachers be like? Caring, encouraging, supporting, Humane and facilitator and teachers should play active part in all activities and Teacher should be Techno-savvy. Presidential remarks were presented by Sh. Nirmal Singh Dhillon, Chairperson and Secretary, Dev Samaj College of Education, Chandigarh who told about the role of teacher in a child’s life and also told about his childhood experience at school and with his teachers. He emphasized the role of education in one’s life and one’s personality development He reiterated that a teacher can’t be a good teacher

without passion for teaching. In the first Technical Session the resource Person was Dr. Taruna Dhall, Principal, University College of Education, Kurukshetra University who said that “learning to teach” is an issue of social interaction, retention and transfer. She made a comparison between a subject expert vs effective teacher. She pointed out the expected roles of teacher so as to enable the learner to discover their fullest potential in order to develop desirable social and human values. 17. Improvements in the Library Services

A proper Stock Register has also been maintained. In addition to this, a mini library has been set up in Dev Samaj Head Office, so that any visitor to the Head Office can go through these books and can get the benefit.

Now to make these valuable books approachable to anyone sitting anywhere in the world, the work of digitization has been started and in Mahotsav (Founders Day) 2013, Dev Shastra, Vol. 1 to 4 had been inaugurated in the form of CD. Introduction of Compulsory Subject ICT Skill Development (Paper V A) from Session 2013-14

From 2013-14, a new subject ICT Skill Development has been introduced by the Pnajib Unversity) with Total Marks of 60, out of which External Theory is of 32 marks and Internal Evaluation is of 6 marks. The external practical comprises of 16 marks and Internal Practical is of 6 marks. The course contents include ICT: Meaning, importance and tools of ICT, Classification of Computers, Generations of computers, Computer Hardware: Input-Output Devices, Memory of computers: Primary and Secondary, Introduction to Operating System (Features of GUI (MS-Windows) and CLI (MS-DOS), Files and directory operations and Windows Explorer and desktop), Introduction to Application Software (Word Processor , Spreadsheets, Presentations and Database Management System., Applications of computers in various fields and specifically in education, Characteristics of a good computerized lesson plan, Application of computer in Teaching Learning Process (Attendance, Evaluation, E-Content, daily planner etc.), Internet: Introduction, advantages and disadvantages.

The Practical component includes Windows, DOS, and Presentations. The student teachers are also expected to know Internet Surfing, working with E-mail & chatting. They also prepare a soft copy of lesson plan in power-point.

Teaching of Computer Education is of total marks 100, out of which external Theory is now of 80 marks and internal practical is of 10 marks and Internal Evaluation is also of 10 marks. The objectives of this subject are to emphasize the need and importance of computer education as a subject, aware the pupils of different

teaching methodologies for teaching of computer education, discuss the importance of computer curriculum and computer textbooks, teach the proper computer laboratory planning and to outline qualifications of computer staff, underline the need and importance of computerized lesson planning and its evaluation and to bring awareness regarding the practical and latest computer technology.
