## **PART B**

The total number of students admitted was 13, 580. The college staff along with the staff from Government College of Education and Punjab University made this counseling possible and a success. The earnestness of the students from all over Punjab and neighboring states made this a unique

experience. The college had been a host to Joint admission in 1999 – 2000 and 2000 – 2001.

### **Zonal Youth & Heritage Festival of the Professional Colleges – Zone “A”**

It was indeed great privilege for the institute to host the Punjab University ZONAL YOUTH & HERITAGE FESTIVAL of the professional colleges – Zone “A” in its Silver Jubilee year from October 22 – 25, 2006. #### **5. EXAMINATION REFORMS IMPLEMENTED**

The evaluation method is communicated to the students at the beginning of the year, the details of which are given in the prospectus also. The evaluation is continuous and comprehensive. Formative and summative evaluation forms integral part of evaluation.

The details are as follow:

❖ **Formative Evaluation:** The various components used for Formative Evaluation are:

- ◆ **House Tests**
- ◆ **Snap Tests**
- ◆ **Unit Tests**

- ◆ **Assignments**
- ◆ **Presentation**
- ❖ **House tests** are conducted twice during the session. They are based on external examination pattern. It is compulsory to appear in both the tests and 20 marks internal assessment is based on the basis of performance of house tests, class tests and assignments in each paper.
  - Monthly test in all the subjects are mandatory for B.Ed class.
  - As per university rules students will have to secure at least 40% marks in each examination and in each paper, otherwise they will not be allowed to appear in the final exams. Any student, who fails to appear in any of the examination papers, for whatever reason, will not be entitled to annual academic prize.
- ❖ **Attendance:** At least 75% attendance is essential to appear in the annual examination and the students having more than 75% are given weightage in internal assessment.

## **1. CRITICAL THINKING WORKSHOP**

“Working Together to Build a Community of Responsive Educator” an innovative initiative by Dev Samaj College brought together the teachers of **The Learning School, Kasur, Pakistan** and teacher trainers of Dev Samaj College of Education was held in the college from May 8 – 12 , 2006.

During the four days Workshop different resource persons i.e. **Batani Devi, Dr. Navita Mahajan, Mrs. Harleen Kohli, Mrs Anupam Dr.Raj Gupta Dr.Urmila Sharma Dr. Indu Rihani, Dr. Manjula Kataria, Dr. Anuradha Agnihotri, Mrs. Anita Nangia, Mrs. Anupam Mahajan & Mrs. Parul Sood** deliberated and training the participants on different themes.

#### **8. NEW COLLABORATIVE RESEARCH PROGRAMMES:**

At Dev Samaj College of Education diverse local relationships and encounters are enriched by the national and international exchange of experience through the institute’s participation in research projects and scientific & educational organization.

The institute in its Silver Jubilee year promoted and initiated research at the issues pertaining to education and trends. The range of areas include the issues related to the prospective teachers performance in B.Ed entrance exams, affect of practice teaching, Role of NAAC towards quality education, Values of secondary school teachers in relation to self concept, comparison of societal sports and non sports prospective teacher with reference to self concept.

The current issues were also taken up for research studies with the aim to contribute more towards the society in general and that segment in particular. The post graduate students investigated the effect of T.V. viewing on mental health of students, effectiveness of HIV Aids awareness, guidance needs of adolescents and impact of environmental awareness etc.

Some pertinent issues relating to educational Psychology were also studied. These include academic anxiety on mental health of adolescents, vocation interests of secondary school students in relation to home environment, emotional maturity, self-esteem and self concept, self confidence in adolescents. Relation of academic achievement and various interests like scientific interest were also taken up, adjustment patterns in relation to intelligence was also studied. Academic stress among children of working and non working mothers, level of aspirations and attitude of adolescents towards modernization in relation to their socio economic status was also analysed.

The interjects which shape the outlook of students of India and Pakistan were also examined as part of the research in peace studies.

The range of research was rooted in attempting to study and understand the issues of present day scenario in the field of education.

**16. COURSES IN WHICH STUDENT ASSESSMENT OF TEACHERS IS INTRODUCED AND THE ACTION TAKEN ON STUDENT FEEDBACK:**

- Students' feedback is taken every year about various course and different subjects through a questionnaire.
- The Principal visits all the classes once in a month and collected feed back in personally from the students.
- A suggestion box has been kept in the college campus and suitable remedial measures are taken on the suggestions and complaints lodged in that.

### **17. UNIT COST OF EDUCATION:**

Our college is an aided college and gets grant-in aid from Panjab University, Chandigarh no donation is collected from the students.

Students are charged only nominal fees. Fee structure copy as mentioned in the college prospectus for 2005-06 is enclosed for reference. (Ref Annexure - 1).

### **18. COMPUTERIZATION OF ADMINISTRATION AND THE PROCESS OF ADMISSIONS AND EXAMINATION RESULTS**

- Admission process is centralized and totally computerized.
- Admission to the B.Ed course is held on the basis of the results of Joint entrance Test conducted by Panjab University, Chandigarh for education colleges in UT.
- Admissions are done through centralized counseling. Admissions are made following the norms of the Panjab Government and eligibility criteria of the Panjab University.
- The candidates are admitted to the college on **merit obtained subject wise** provided he/she fulfils the requisite eligibility conditions of the

Panjab University which are displayed on big computer screens during the centralized counseling.

- Transparency is maintained through displaying the allotment of seats of different colleges through computers.

### **ADMISSION PROCESS FOR M.ED**

**Admission to the M.Ed course is on the basis of 50%** of B.Ed score and 50% of **results of** Joint entrance Test conducted by Panjab University, Chandigarh. A centralized counseling is held after the entrance test based on the norms and reservation policy of Chandigarh administration as given above.

### **ADMISSION PROCESS FOR POST GRADUATE DIPLOMA IN GUIDANCE AND COUNSELING**

The admission to this course is on the basis of marks obtained in qualifying exams. No entrance test is conducted for it.

- ◆ The proposed number of seats for this course is 40.
- ◆ The duration of the course is one year divided into two semesters.
- ◆ **The minimum qualification** for the admission is a Bachelor degree in any discipline of any recognized university with not less than 50% marks in aggregate.
- ◆ Preference is given to the candidates possessing Bachelor of education (B.Ed), Nursery Teacher training (NTT) or ETT (with a BA degree).
- ◆ The admission to Post Graduate Diploma in Guidance and Counseling is done strictly on the basis of merit following Chandigarh administration reservation policy and Panjab University norms.

### **19. INCREASE IN THE INFRASTRUCTURAL FACILITIES:**

In the session 2008-09, there was a no major change in the infrastructure facilities. However the college plans to make an extension of the present building in the next session.

## **20. TECHNOLOGY UPGRADATION:**

- The college has well equipped Technology lab with slide projector, overhead projector, LCD, Television, VCR, geometrical figures, models, charts, maps, transparencies, slides, white board, flannel board, etc. of standard quality. The Students use all the audio-visual aids with the help of the teachers.
- Teachers make use of various aids for the teaching purpose & giving demonstration lessons to make the learning of various topics interesting and effective.
- Slides and Transparencies are made by each and every student.

## **21. COMPUTER AND INTERNET ACCESS AND TRAINING TO TEACHERS AND STUDENTS**

- Our college provides computer and internet access to the teachers and the students round the year.
- Teachers can search through various websites and collect up to date information.
- They compile it and help the students to update their knowledge.
- Students are also benefited by the Internet access and training in making their lesson plans and other presentations in student seminars.
- LCD projector and OHP are available all the time to teachers and students.



## **22. FINANCIAL AID TO STUDENTS**

The students were given scholarships and fee concessions on the basis of certain criteria, these are:

- 1) The priority is given to those students, who come from poor socio-economic background and can not thus afford college fee. They are given fee concessions, their uniforms are sponsored and books from the book bank are provided for the whole session. Occasionally their fee is taken care off by the college staff.
- 2) Meritorious students are provided scholarships as per college rules.

## **23. ACTIVITIES AND SUPPORT FROM THE ALUMNI ASSOCIATION:**

The alumni association is named (SANGAM), meaning the fusion of present and past students. It supports the college in all its endeavours. It was formed in 2000-2001. The alumni association holds annual meet in which valuable suggestions from the alumni members are taken, which are implemented in due course of time. Every year more and more members are added. This year the number of alumni members added surpassed all numbers of previous years.

## **27. INCENTIVES TO OUTSTANDING SPORTSPERSONS:**

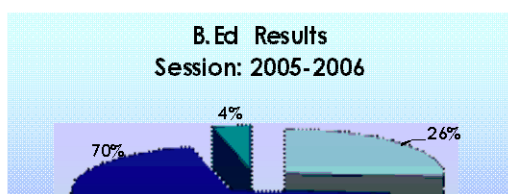
The college appreciates the hard work and the spirit of the sportspersons. They are thus suitably rewarded for their outstanding contributions in sports in the following forms:
