Police station Visit 30th May, 2024

As part of the Add-On course in Human Rights and Value Education, the students of our college recently visited the Police Station in Sector 36, Chandigarh. This educational visit was organized to provide the students with first hand exposure to the functioning of a modern police station and to enhance their understanding of law enforcement mechanisms.

The session was conducted by **Sub-Inspector Sh. Om Prakash**, who guided the students through various facets of police operations and technological advancements in law enforcement. The interactive session focused on critical areas, including:

1. Surveillance and Helpline Services

Students learned about the surveillance systems employed by the police to ensure public safety and the importance of helpline numbers as tools for prompt assistance during emergencies.

2. E-FIR System

The Sub-Inspector explained the streamlined process of filing an FIR (First Information Report) online, which enhances accessibility for citizens and reduces procedural delays.

3. Maintenance of Records

An insight into the meticulous methods used by the police for record-keeping was provided, emphasizing the importance of accuracy in crime-related documentation.

4. MHS Room (Malkhana Handling System)

Students observed the organized management of seized property and evidence within the MHS room, ensuring transparency and accountability.

5. ICMS Portal and CCTNS

The Integrated Criminal Management System (ICMS) and Crime and Criminal Tracking Network System (CCTNS) were showcased, highlighting their role in interconnecting police stations nationwide for effective crime tracking and investigation.



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6. **TGIS Portal and LAR Generation**

The Sub-Inspector elaborated on the use of the TGIS Portal (Technology for Generating Investigative Support) and the process of Local Area Report (LAR) generation, which aids in strategizing police operations.

7. **Evidence and Material Management**

The visit provided an understanding of the handling and preservation of evidence, a critical aspect of the judicial process.

8. **Communication and Emergency Response**

The students were briefed on the efficient communication channels and emergency response systems that enable swift action during crises.

The visit proved to be an enriching experience for the students, broadening their knowledge of human rights, law enforcement technologies, and the pivotal role of the police in maintaining societal order. Such initiatives not only complement academic learning but also instill a deeper sense of civic responsibility among students.
