International Women's Day

Underlining the similarities in problems faced by women in South Asia, today on the eve of World Women Day, on March 7, 2009, Peace Club of the College in collaboration with Yuvasatta, and New India Assurance Co. Ltd., organized an Indo Pak Dialogue Empowering Women in South Asia.

Prominent amongst those who participated in the discussions from Pakistan included Miss. Saeeda Diep who heads the Institute Secular Studies in Lahore, Miss Amina Zaaman, head of Agency for National Development Faisalabad, Miss Zakia Arshad who is associated with women Development Programme of South Asia Partnership and Mr. Qamar Hayat, and Executive Director Sahara Development foundation in North Western Frontier Province. Mr.B.C.Gupta, IAS, Principal, Secretary, Government of Punjab was the Chief Guest on the occasion and Madhavi Kataria, PCS, Chief Manager, Markfed presided over

the event. Dr. Jyoti Khanna< Principal of the college welcomed the Chief Guest, the guests and other prominent personalities present on the occasion. Addressing the participants Miss. Saeeda Diep said that that," The Pakistani constitution guarantees equals rights to men and women whether they belong to the majority or minority communities. But it is definitely struggle to ensure women their rights. "She further suggested on the lines of SAARC, the South Asian women's groups can come together on a common platform to fight for their common rights of equity and justice.

Taking part in the discussion Madhavi Kataria suggested that today the emerging need is to tighter take up issues like female feticide, trafficking, and marriage laws, maternal mortality rate, education and health for a girl child or women friendly society.

"Pakistan would soon have a law against domestic violence. Under pressure from women's groups, the government would table in parliament women's protection will aimed at reforming the 'HUDOOD' laws that put the onus of the proving the rape on the women." added Miss Zakia Arshad

Terming the rise of fundamentalism the biggest threat to women's rights in her country, Miss Amina Zaaman," In the 1960s and 70s, the societies were open, but know with the rise in fundamentalism, we have to work hard to ensure that women get their constitutional rights".

Mr. Pramod Sharma, Coordinator, Yuvasatta, shared that the traditional Indian Society, based on a highly stratified caste system, represent an extremely, complex, diverse Institutionalized system of inequality forces, which has been past down to generations. New social forces have emerged, giving birth to new forms of inequality. Despite the constitutional guarantee of equality between the sexes, the women, girls in particular face much discrimination which impinges on her rights as human beings.

EARTH DAY - 2009

NSS volunteers of the college celebrated the Earth Day 2009 by involving the students of different schools of Chandigarh. The various activities conducted in the schools were paragraph writing on the themes "Save Earth" & "Environment Protection", poster making on "Choosing Recyclable Products" and lectures and discussions were also conducted on the theme "Global Warming & Environmental Pollution" and the importance of using Compact Fluorescent Lamps to save energy. Exhibition was also conducted on Environment by displaying the Slogans and Posters on the theme "Save Energy". The celebration was concluded in the college premises by administering a Pledge on the occasion of Earth Day 2009 to protect the natural resources on earth for environmental sustainability and human survival.

Inauguration of Exhibition on Prisoners of War

Recognizing the valour of Indian Army soldiers, the Peace Club of Dev Samaj College organized the inaugural of an Exhibition on "Prisoners of War", by Retd. Major General Sudesh Kumar. This three days exhibition is the compilation by Hira Lal Yadav of beautiful paintings and posters from all over the country showcasing the plight of prisoners of war who are still languishing in jails in Pakistan.

2. NEW ACADEMIC PROGRAMMES INITIATED (UG AND PG):

The college runs courses like B.Ed, M.Ed and Post Graduate Diploma in Guidance and Counselling. In the session 2005-06 the college started the Post Graduate Diploma in Guidance and Counselling course. During this session there was no new course added as such but **coaching classes for UGC-NET** in Education were started. In the previous years coaching was going on for only B.Ed and M.Ed Entrance tests.

3. INNOVATIONS IN CURRICULAR DESIGN AND TRANSACTION:

- All academic programmes are strictly followed as prescribed by P.U. Chandigarh
- The University seeks suggestions from the members of the faculty for curriculum design.
- Teachers are encouraged to make teaching plans at the very beginning of the session and Syllabi are unitized according to teaching schedules.
- The college supplements the lecture method of teaching by holding seminars, talks, symposia etc.
- Short Quizzes on each compulsory subject are also prepared by the members of the faculty for ready reference and for better understanding and for securing good marks in the university examinations.
- Home assignments, group discussion, class test, student seminar and advanced technology in classroom transaction have also been included by all the departments. Field trips and visit to other institutions are also organised to provide exposure to the students

4. INTER-DISCIPLINARY PROGRAMMES STARTED:

The main inter-disciplinary programmes during this year were:

Quality Education for Quality Institutions – An Extension Lecture

Prof. Ramesh Verma, Advisor, Commonwealth Learners Association, Jammu University, delivered an extension lecture on 9th August 2008, in the college campus on the theme "Quality Education for Quality Institutions". Prof.Verma, through multimedia presentations presented his vision on future learners. He was of the view that if quality education would not be provided to the students, the future learners would be shirkers. He further said that it is the responsibility

of teacher educators to prepare such teachers and institutions to prevent such a catastrophe.

Teaching Skills – Extension Lecture by Dr. Vij

Dr. D.R.Vij spoke on the "The Micro Skills and Teaching: Bases of effective Classroom teaching" on 2nd February 09. It was an extremely proactive session. Dr. Vij elaborated on different kinds of skills that are important for effective teaching. After brief discussion on different micro skills such as Skill of Stimulus Variation, Skill of Illustrating with Examples, Skill of using audio Visual aids, Dr. Vij focussed on the skill of Using Blackboard by giving demonstration and also explaining the technicalities of using a blackboard. Dr. Vij also answered the queries posed by the students.

5. EXAMINATION REFORMS IMPLEMENTED:

This college is affiliated to Panjab University Chandigarh.. Hence, we strictly follow the norms set by Panjab University in conducting Examinations in B.Ed., M.Ed. and post Graduate Diploma in Guidance and Counselling. The college also conducts internal house tests twice as per the university rules and a proportion of weightage in internal assessment is also given on the basis of marks in these tests as per university rules.

The examination reforms implemented were:

- 1. The college conducts class tests in every month to make the students face the annual examinations with confidence.
- 2. Question papers are set for the house tests in the pattern of the University examination.
- 3. A separate booklet is issued to the students for the purpose of writing this examination, for uniformity.

- 4. Evaluation is done in a systematic way following the 'scheme of evaluation'. The mistakes are indicated to the students, which enable them to identify and rectify in the University examinations.
- 5. Parents are also informed by sending letters about those students who do not perform well in the exams.
- 6. The whole examination process is done under the guidance of the examination committee.

6. CANDIDATES QUALIFIED: NET/SLET/GATE ETC.

Every year some of our students qualify UGC-NET examination in the faculty of Education. The M.Ed students are still appearing in their final examination of Panjab University and after the end of their exams they will attempt to qualify the UGC-NET examination.

7. INITIATIVES TOWARDS FACULTY DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMME:

Journalism is for Service – A talk by Prof. Thomas

The main purpose of Media Literacy Programme was aimed to help parents, teachers and students to become more discriminating in the use of mass media, distinguish between reality and fantasy and separate fact from fiction, reflect whether media values are their values, pursue character and value education. It was to create awareness about the pervasiveness of the media in their lives.

Post Graduate Research Studies

At Dev Samaj College of Education diverse local relationships and encounters are enriched by the national and international exchange of experience through the institute's participation in research projects and scientific educational organization.

The institute promotes and initiates research pertaining to education and trends. The range of areas include the issues related to comparative study of utilization of Mathematics laboratory in different schools, Impact of school environment on creativity among the students of Chandigarh schools, adjustment of

prospective teachers in relation to their marital status, and educational interests of under-graduate students in relation to their socio-economic Status.

Research was also done on educational philosophies of Guru Nanak Dev ji, Bal Ganga Dhar Tilak and their relevance to the modern System of Indian education and on the educational thoughts of Acharaya Rajneesh.

Some pertinent issues relating to Educational Psychology were also studied. These include self confidence in relation to personality traits and parental encouragement of senior secondary school students, adjustment among adolescents in relation to self esteem, mental health of undergraduate students in relation to social and emotional intelligence, effect of teaching practice on anxiety and self-confidence of pupil teachers, attitude of adolescents towards modernization in relation to personality traits, level of aspiration of class IX students in relation to socio emotional climate of the school, attitude of parents towards their mentally challenged children in relation to socio- economic status and a study of social competence among adolescents in relation to parenting style and teaching effectiveness in relation to occupational stress among senior secondary school teachers were also analysed.

The current issues were also taken up for research with the aim to contribute more towards the society in general and that segment in particular. The post graduate students studied the job Satisfaction among secondary school teachers in relation to personality types, a comparative study of mental health of yogic and non-yogic prospective teachers, attitude of parents and teachers towards coeducation at secondary level, attitude of adolescents towards gender discrimination in relation to socio-economic status and a Study of guidance needs of rural and urban adolescents.
